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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

GEZORA must win this race, as any other result would be a bit of an embarrassment. So far, her season has not gone to plan, and she was moved from Chad Brown to Bill Mott after being beaten as the odds-on favorite on her seasonal debut. That was over the wrong trip - though her first start for Mott was even worse; and she now returns to 12 furlongs, which is probably her optimum distance around US tracks.

But for her last placed finish in the 9.5-furlong New York Stakes at this venue in June, Gezora would never be as big as **2-1** in this company, and perhaps she won't be either. It's hard to back a horse after a run like her last effort though this is a case of trusting top class connections to do the right thing with a valuable G1 winner. Would Mott run her in the Glens Falls if she's not right? Probably not. Her performance in the New York was simply too bad to be true - something must have been amiss that day. Draw a line through that result and we are looking at a favorite whose best form is well above what her Glens Falls rivals have done, and her second best is also good enough to send her back to the winners' circle - unless the English shipper **SUIRVE** suddenly bounces back to her best (which seems rather unlikely). Gezora was beaten also on her seasonal debut, going down by 1 1/4 lengths to Kathynmarissa in the 9-furlong Modesty Stakes at Churchill Downs in May. The distance was too short for Gezora and she was spotting the winner 5lbs. Kathynmarissa was 8-1 on the morning line that day but received strong support and went off at just 3-1. She has since franked the form by winning the Diana Stakes (after an unfortunate third in the New York Stakes).

Gezora captured the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Del Mar last year, when she was also a classic winner in France. She performed to **Globeform 118p** to beat She Feels Pretty by half a length over 11 furlongs at Del Mar, the same mark she had returned when winning the Prix de Diane (French Oaks). Gezora's run prior to the Breeders' Cup was in the 12-furlong Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, where she had a bad draw, ended up too far back in the field from the outset and was unplaced, 10 3/4 lengths behind her top class stable companion Daryz on very soft ground. The race was dominated by horses prominent or ridden just off the pace, and Gezora's run was best forgotten. She performed a lot better than the result might suggest, and she did not have a hard race.

She had been impressive when capturing the Prix de Diane over 10.5 furlongs at Chantilly last June. Gezora did not face strong G1 performers that day but she was much the best as she quickened past rivals inside the final furlong, beating Bedtime Story by a length, with Cenkora third. As many as seven subsequent stakes winners came out of that classic. Given a traditional French Arc prep, i.e. a break right through the summer, Gezora was exiting a near three-month rest when running in the Prix Vermeille in September, where she was an eye catching second to the high class filly Aventure (who ran second in the Prix de l'Arc in 2024). That run set Gezora up for the Arc, and next for a successful trip to Del Mar, where she made her last start for French champion trainer Francis-Henri Graffard. Unless her two runs this year have combined to make her lose interest in the game, Gezora is the one to beat here. She stays well and she acts on any ground. It was firm when she won at Del Mar but note that her wins in the Prix Saint Alary and Prix de Diane, as well as her second in the Prix Vermeille, were all on ground described as 'good to soft' in France. That equates to soft or yielding in North America.

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SURVIE ran her best race to date when fourth in the Prix Vermeille over 12 furlongs at Longchamp last September, beaten 3 1/4 lengths by the winner, Aventure, and 1 3/4 lengths by runner-up **GEZORA**. That performance earned her **Globeform 114** and she was even being talked about as a possible 'Arc' contender. Trained by Nicolas Clement and Frauke Hermans at the time, she instead went for the Prix de Royallieux over 14 furlongs, a top level fillies' and mares' contest at the Arc meeting, but was virtually pulled up in last place. Sent to the Tattersalls December Sales in England, she sold for 1.9 million guineas (around \$2.7 mill.) and was transferred to trainer George Boughey in Newmarket. Boughey is a young, up and coming trainer with excellent results, but he has not been able to rediscover Suirve's best form. She beat little when taking a minor event on the Polytrack at Lingfield in January, was then way below her best when a distant third in the Dahlia Stakes over the straight course at Newmarket in May; though ran better when sixth to Map of Stars on the 10-furlong Wolferton Stakes at Royal Ascot in June, when she stayed on late and performed to GF 103+ as she reached the winning post 3 1/2 lengths behind the winner, who won a G2 in France last year.

Wolferton runner-up Wimbledon Hawkeye (winner of the Nashville Derby at Kentucky Downs last year) was beaten only half a length when third to Hotazhell in a G1 in Germany on Sunday. Suirve's run at >>> Ascot (where Ryan Moore took her very slowly down to the start) suggested that she *might* be on her way back, and 12 furlongs suits this filly best - but the inner course at Saratoga is completely different to Longchamp, a right handed track with a long straight, and it's not exactly close to Ascot either. This expensive filly is badly in need of a G1 win, and those are easier to grab in the US than in Europe, where she probably isn't good enough to succeed at the top level. Perhaps Survie has been shipped across the pond to be transferred to a US barn; and not mainly because the Glens Falls has been a target. Taking in a race straight off the plane is quite common for such imports. Either way, she's hard to fancy as a win contender.

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BELLEZZA's connections will no doubt be keeping a close eye on the weather forecast leading up to Glens Falls day, as their contender needs firm ground to be fully effective. She might not get such conditions this week, and her two runs in 2026 have been below par. The first, a sixth placed finish in the Orchid Stakes at Gulfstream Park in March, was probably as a result of being in need of the race; while the second, a frustrating fourth in the Robert Dick Memorial at Delaware Park in June, was as a result of a terribly unlucky trip. Bellezza was blocked and badly checked on the home turn that day and lost all chance there and then. **DONA CLOTA**, **ALLURING ANGEL** and the disqualified **STORM MIAMI** all passed the winning post in front of her, but Bellezza was beaten no more than a length. She probably would have won with a clean trip. Bellezza is one of the best runners in the Glens Falls field though she is also burdened with 124lbs, the same weight as Breeders' Cup winner Gezora and 4lbs more than Alluring Angel, who is thus 4lbs better off compared to their meeting in the Dick Memorial. Weights carried can make a big difference in these race but the pace is also a vital factor. Although she closed well into what was no more than an average pace when winning the 11-furlong Flower Bowl Stakes at Saratoga last August, this daughter of Siyouni would probably be best suited by a good pace - something that is by no means guaranteed. She improved to **Globeform 113** to beat Amber Cascade quite easily by 2 1/4 lengths in the Flower Bowl Stakes over 11 furlongs on the inner course at Saratoga last August, a race that set her up for a crack at the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Del Mar in November. Bellezza wasn't quite settled in that contest and she never got properly into the race, but her sixth placed finish, 5 lengths behind **GEZORA**, was not a bad effort. Del Mar is very different to Saratoga and not her type of course. The Spa is more to her liking, and she should be respected here - particularly if the course is riding on the firm side.

DONA CLOTA, winner of G1 events over 10 and 12 furlongs on dirt in her native Chile back in 2024, improved to **Globeform 108** when capturing the Robert Dick Memorial Stakes over 11 furlongs at Delaware Park in June, taking the race by a neck from **ALLURING ANGEL** with a good kick from off the pace. The Saffie Joseph Jr trainee was coming off a sixth placed finish in the 9-furlong Modesty Stakes at Churchill Downs (won by Kathynmarissa from **GEZORA**) and the step back up in distance clearly suited Dona Clota, who ran a good race also when third in the 11-furlong The Very One Stakes at Gulfstream Park in February (but was below par in the Orchid over the same course a month later). She is now 2lbs worse off at the weights with Alluring Angel and as much as 4lbs worse off with Bellezza, who was badly hampered on the home turn and probably would have won but for such traffic issues (finishing fourth, she lost by just a length). Bellezza is the best one of these, while **ALLURING ANGEL** is the one who would not mind a steady pace, something that could well happen if (as expected) rain makes the ground soft - and thus unsuitable for Bellezza. Alluring Angel can make her own pace if needed; she led every step of the way setting slow fractions when beating next out Listed winner No Show Sammy Jo by 1 1/4 lengths in the Long Island Stakes over 11 furlongs around the inner course at Aqueduct last November.

STORM MIAMI, who was disqualified for having caused interference when third past the post behind **DONA CLOTA** and **ALLURING ANGEL** in the Dick Memorial at Delaware Park, is the other one in this field who will be comfortable going to the lead. She tried to make all at Delaware and actually kept on well to the line, though Dona Clota and Alluring Angel both went by her - and the fourth placed **BELLEZZA** would have done the same without the interference. >>>

3 bets - 3 winners & stone cold 23-1 Pick 3

SPEED SHOPPER, who ran to **Globeform 109p** when beating Ayra Stark by 1 3/4 lengths to win the Christophe Clement Stakes over 12 furlongs at Gulfstream Park in January, has returned GF 106+, GF 107+ and GF 100 in her three subsequent starts, with the only below par effort coming last time out, when she beat just one home in the eight-runner New York Stakes at Saratoga in early June. That 'one horse' was **GEZORA**, who ran as if something was amiss. Speed Shopper was unsuited by the 9.5-furlong distance; 12 furlongs is what she wants and when she gets a stamina test she's pretty good. After taking the Clement, she ran third to Sultana in the Orchid Stakes in March (also over 12 fur. at Gulfstream), then returned to winning form in the Bewitch Stakes over 12 furlongs at Keeneland in April, when she beat Golden Sunshine by 1 1/4 lengths. Speed Shopper has hit the board in 8 of her 12 races and she's a likeable sort, though she is a runner who is best suited by being given the opportunity of closing into a good pace; this race is a furlong shorter than her ideal trip and the inner course may also pose a challenge.

CONCLUSION: Gezora may seem like a risky proposition given the flop last time out, but she is impossible to oppose. If she's lost interest, well, then we're in trouble and she might be heading for retirement. If she runs back to her best she wins easily; if she runs back to her Modesty form she also wins. Selecting a B-horse is not as straightforward, but two names stand out from the rest; Bellezza (who wants firm ground and a decent pace) and Alluring Angel (who is likely to benefit from rain triggering a slow pace), while the Euro shipper Survie is a bit hard to assess. Her trip was not perfect-perfect at Ascot and three horses have come out of that race with good placed efforts since. Her best 2025 form was good enough to beat most of these (and it was achieved with give underfoot) so she should be part of any Trifecta plan. As should the in-form Dona Clota. That she was effective on dirt in Chile may mean that she'll handle soft just as well as firm turf.

UPDATE: Alluring Angel was the 'winner of the new draw' when this race was re-entered for the Sunday card. Now set to break from post 1, she should get very good trip - and her chances increase even more if Storm Miami defects and goes for the Beverly D Stakes. Alluring Angel can become to lone speed and she's no doubt the value bet here. She was **12-1** on the initial morning line; that's way too big.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

BOURBON BETTY is **way too big at 8-1** on the morning line in this race. The question mark is the distance, as she is stepping up from 8 furlongs on the inner course to 8.5 furlongs on the outer; but otherwise she ticks lots of boxes. Perfectly drawn by the rail, this front-running daughter of Mendelssohn could become the controlling speed and enjoy a nice tactical advantage. There are others who like to go forward in this 12-runner contest but she has the best starting point, she is the top rated horse, and she is coming off a career best effort. Bourbon Betty ran a game race when failing by just a length in her attempt at making all in a similar contest here three weeks ago. Setting a decent pace, she kept on well right to the wire, but the two four-year-olds Eponine and Accent both managed to get by her in the closing stages. Eponine was third in the Lake Placid at Saratoga last year, and she was now coming off a close second to Marketplaceofideas (see Crossover Capital) in a race where Accent ran fourth. Bourbon Betty, an easy maiden winner over 6 furlongs at Aqueduct in April (but unplaced next time out), clearly appreciated the step up to a mile and she improved to **Globeform 99** behind Eponine (**NEW ROSE** was seventh, 3 lengths behind her). Her dam never ran but the second dam, Social Queen, was a smart performer who won the Eatontown Handicap and the Gallorette Handicap, both over 8.5 furlongs on turf. Bourbon Betty looks a value bet today.

SOLOIST, representing a somewhat unpredictable barn, ran two good races in defeat in stakes company last year; taking fifth only 3/4 length behind Meringue in the 8-furlong Kentucky Downs Juvenile Fillies and fourth, 1 1/4 lengths behind the classy Imaginationthelady in the Jessamine Stakes over 8.5 furlongs at Keeneland, where the daughter of Into Mischief ran on from just off the pace and improved to **Globeform 98**. Her three performances this season have not been as good, though she ran respectably for third behind How About Now in the Cleopatra Stakes over a mile at Indiana in May, and again when runner-up to Miss Fulton Gal in the Christina Stakes over a sloppy dirt track at Delaware Park in June. Miss Fulton Gal has been entered for both the CCA Oaks at Saratoga and the Monmouth Oaks today. Soloist's best 2yo form would make her a win contender in this allowance race but she does not seem to have progressed at three.

CROSSOVER CAPITAL, Chad Brown's only runner in this race, made a winning debut in maiden company over 8.5 furlongs at Tampa Bay Downs in June. Unusually for a runner from this barn, she was not favorite but went off at over 4-1. The reason was probably that she was not thought to be mentally ready and / or that the distance might be too short (judged on her breeding). She pulled and was immature in the race but she was by no means slow and - although she didn't beat much - she won impressively. Swinging wide on the home turn, she quickened sharply to blow past her rivals for a comfortable 2 1/4-length win. Her barnmate Mistborne, who had run third to Marketpaceofideas (another Brown trainee; see Bourbon Betty) at Aqueduct in April, while the race favorite Olatz ran third (she was third also next time out). A maiden heat like that is hard to assess but Crossover Capital earned a provisional **Globeform 96p**; she is capable of beating much better than what she was up against and she looks very interesting here. Virtually certain to have improved for the experience, she is **5-1 on the morning line**; that really does seem too big. **WON @ 9-2**

Bought for \$205,000 in France as a yearling, Crossover Capital is a daughter of high class 12-furlong performer Zarak. Her dam, Grace And Danger, raced in England, where she won an 8.5-furlong maiden on her only start as a juvenile, and placed in a pair of Listed events at three (11.5 and 12.5 furlongs). She has also thrown an ordinary mile winner in England. This family has produced Niagara Causeway, who won the Tokyo City Handicap over 12 furlongs on dirt. Bred to go long, Crossover Capital sticks to 8.5 furlongs as she moves up in class this week, but she has good tactical speed and the distance will not be a problem.

NEW ROSE was a solid one-length winner of an 8.5-furlong maiden at Saratoga in early June. Racing in the first two from gate to wire, she beat Home Wrecker and the Chad Brown trained favorite Shelzawa as Secretly Delighted filled fourth place. A month later, Shelzawa won a similar event over the same course, with Secretly Delighted fourth and Home Wrecker fifth - an on the same day New Rose stepped up to allowance company. She ran respectably but six fillies beat her to the winning post, including the third placed **BELLA BOURBON**, who was 3 lengths better than her. New Rose was once more up with the pace but tired and a mile might suit her best. >>>

BELLA KNOWS is well worth a look. She improved to **Globeform 94** when taking second, 2 lengths behind Deep Learning, in the Chelsey Flower Stakes over 8.5 furlongs at Aqueduct last November, and was then off right up to June 11, when she was runner-up to Right Timing in an allowance race over the same course and distance. Right Timing, a very nice filly trained by Chad Brown, won impressively by 3 1/2 lengths but Bella Knows made a pleasing comeback and there's probably improvement in this filly. She had the third placed **ABIGAIL** 3 lengths behind her.

VEKOMA VIEW was disappointing in the Penn Oaks last time out, fading to be a well beaten fifth of six behind Bandiagara, who runs in the Ontario Colleen Stakes at Woodbine today (unfortunately 20 min. after this race). Vekoma's previous form was much better and she gets blinkers for this race. She was impressive winning a maiden event over 7.5 furlongs at Gulfstream Park back in February. Sent straight to the lead, she bossed her rivals throughout and was a comfortable 1 1/2-length winner from two useful looking newcomers in Use Me and Dreaming of Joy . Celebrity Warrior, beaten 6 1/4 lengths in fifth place, was second in the Selima Stakes last year, when she also ran respectably in eighth place 3 1/2 lengths behind Balantina at the Breeders' Cup. Vekoma View earned **Globeform 92p** in her maiden breaker and she ran to the same level when a bit unlucky in the Sanibel Island Stakes, also over 7.5 furlongs at Gulfstream, in February. Blocked at a crucial stage, she was beaten 2 1/2 lengths in fourth place behind Tam Tam, who has gone on to frank the form since. Vekoma View showed good speed on her debut but she is a half-sister to American Oaks runner-up Cliffs, and 8.5 furlongs should be well within her compass.

KOKOMOTION, potentially a big improver with just two runs under her belt, has contrasting (albeit to the same level) performances in the book, both over 8.5 furlongs at Tampa Bay Downs. She came from off the pace when powering home by 6 1/4 lengths on her debut in February, but was up with the pace the whole way when third as the favorite in the Florida Oaks a month later. Dandona won the race by 1 1/4 lengths from Time to Dream, who was 2 1/4 lengths better than Kokomotion. It looked a very good race at the time but the trouble is that nothing that has happened since suggests that it was. Kokomotion ran to **Globeform 90p** in her maiden and she returned GF 89+ in the Florida Oaks; where her stamina seemed to be stretched. She could turn out to be much better than her current rating but having her as the 3-1 favorite seems strange; particularly from the widest post. >>>

ABOUT GLOBEFORM RATINGS

Globeform ratings are class ratings expressed in pounds, based on winning margins and weights carried. **Length values:** 5-6 fur: 3lbs / 7 fur: 2.5lbs / 8 - 11 fur: 2lbs / 12 - 13 fur: 1.5lbs / 14 fur. plus: 1lb. Length values are not absolutely fixed regardless of ground conditions and pace. A slowly run race over 12 furlongs can get length value 2lbs (i.e. be treated as a 10-fur race due to the lack of pace). Equally, a 10-fur race run on heavy ground may be treated like a 12-fur race, due to the emphasis on stamina in that contest.

Note that **Globeform's weight-for-age scale** differs slightly from the various official scales being used and Globeform's own weight-for-age scale for European races differs from Globeform's 'wfa' scale for North American races.

What is the difference between rating figures with "p" and "+"?
Notice these differences in the ratings columns for some horses.

When "p" is being used it means that the horse produced a new career best and was given a "plus", denoting that improvement can be expected. When a "+" is being used it means that better than this can be expected next time out, but that the rating the horse ran to on this day was not a new career best (it was either equal to his previous best or below his previous best).

CONCLUSION: A somewhat open looking 3yo fillies' heat on the lawn, this is race well worth getting involved in. It is also a race that's likely to throw up a future stakes winner, possibly a few. **Crossover Capital** is the selection; she was visually so impressive on her debut, earning a high rating for a newcomer, she is well drawn in post two, she is likely to get the right pace setup to suit her combination of speed and stamina, and getting Flavien Prat doesn't hurt either. **It's hard to believe that she will be as big as 5-1.** Bourbon Betty, clearly overpriced at **8-1** on the morning line, also makes a lot of appeal. Provided she breaks cleanly she will be set for a nice, prominent and ground saving trip from post one. Vekoma View, New Rose Bella Knows and Kokomotion, all open to improvement, come next in the selections box.
