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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

FITZ RIGHT was impressive when coming from off the pace for a smooth 3 1/2-length win over Imperatrice in the Memories of Silver Stakes over a mile at Aqueduct in April, when **QUIET STREET** was another length back in third place. It was Fitz Right's second win from as many starts in 2026; she was a very comfortable allowance winner over the same distance at Tampa Bay Downs in January. Coming from off the pace she absolutely outclassed her rivals in the Memories of Silver, winning under a hand ride and galloping out with energy. The daughter of Charlatan improved to **Globeform 104p** and she looks the one to beat here. **Morning line 4-1 is definitely too big** for this Chad Brown trainee. Her runner-up Imperatrice ran second in the Forward Gal Stakes (on dirt) in January, Quiet Street was third to subsequent Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf third Ground Support in the Miss Grillo last year, and Piper's Gift - who ran fourth in the Memories of Silver - won the Princess Elizabeth Stakes at Woodbine last year. These are good form lines and Fitz Right, set to carry 2lbs less than the morning line favorite Lion Lake, has an excellent chance. The step up in distance will be to her liking.

LION LAKE has been improving nicely in her three most recent races; winning the Herecomesthebride Stakes at Gulfstream Park in February, running third in the Appalachian Stakes at Keeneland in April (both over a mile) and third again in the 8.5-furlong Edgewood Stakes at Churchill Downs in May. She lost by just a neck behind Storm's Wake at Keeneland and the margin was the same behind Imaginationthelady at Churchill Downs, where Lion Lake was close to the pace all the way. She was a bit further back at Keeneland, and third in the early part of the race at Gulfstream Park (where prominent trips are best). Lion Lake improved to **Globeform 102** last time out, she is game and genuine and she has an obvious chance.

TIME TO DREAM looked a future star when cruising home by 5 lengths in the P G Johnson Stakes on her second start at Saratoga last year. She has run good races since, but she has not been able to improve on her Saratoga form, so can be filed under 'somewhat disappointing' for the time being. She had a terrible draw and ran better than the result suggests when third to Imaginationthelady in the Jessamine Stakes at Keeneland last October, and she had a bad trip also when second to Dandona in the Florida Oaks at Tampa Bay Downs on her seasonal debut in March. The Jessamine form has worked out well, the Florida Oaks form has not worked out too well. Time to Dream's most recent start was a below par effort in the Edgewood at Churchill Downs, where she was seventh, albeit no more than 2 1/2 lengths behind Imaginationthelady, who beat Tam Tam and **LION LAKE**. Will a return to Saratoga move Time to Dream back up? Hard to say.

SOLOIST ran her best race to date when fourth behind Imaginationthelady, Tam Tam and **LION LAKE** in the Jessamine Stakes at Keeneland last year; outrunning her 15-1 odds she checked in just 1 1/4 lengths behind the winner and moved up to **Globeform 98**. As she gets in on 120lbs and will be receiving weight from the top contenders, this filly sits high on the ranking, but her two runs this term have been a long way below the Jessamine form and she is hard to fancy.

TAX HOLIDAY, like Fitz Right trained by Chad Brown, just got the better of her barnmate Academia when winning a maiden race over a mile on the inner track at Aqueduct in April. Her runner-up had finished sixth to **LION LAKE** in a Gulfstream maiden in January and Tax Holiday may not have beaten much - but she is entitled to improve and might be a Trifecta contender. Note that Majestic Moonlight, who was beaten 2 3/4 lengths in third behind Tax Holiday, has been entered for R6 today (although as an AE horse).

CALL ON ME is an intriguing entry. She has a lot to find on form and it's interesting to see that George Arnold runs her in this contest, which is markedly tougher than the Regret Stakes and the Penn Oaks last week. Arnold scratched Call On Me from both in order to wait for the Wonder Again. Though she has never been favorite in three starts (including a maiden win over an easy next-out winner at Keeneland) perhaps we should keep an eye on the board for this filly. Then again, her presence here may well be because her owners want to have a runner on Belmont day. >>>

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CONCLUSION: Fitz Right makes a lot of appeal in this contest; she won for fun at Aqueduct and she represents a trainer who has won six of the twelve editions of this race. If she improves again, which is very likely, she won't be easy to handle. Lion Lake is far more exposed and can't be expected to make significant improvement, but she is the obvious B-horse; ahead of Time to Dream, who may finally put it all together after some frustrating runs so far this season. The talent is there, it's a matter of bringing it back out. Her trainer has also done well in the Wonder Again - but one observation on Pletcher's good 2yo turf runners; some of them simply fail to progress at three.

Pick 3 opportunity: This race starts an interesting P3. Acorn favorite Always a Runner must be a single in leg two, and we can start the P3 with Fitz Right and Lion Lake in this race; then round it off with three in the New York Stakes; Kathynmarissa, Gezora and the French raider Cankoura. 2 x 1 x 3 = 6 lines.
