

68-1 Call Sign Seven won!

Saturday | Seabiscuit Handicap winner Call Sign Seven was recommended as the best value bet. He won the race at 68-1.

Sunday | 11-2 Cecil B. DeMille selection Unrivaled Time won, topping nice 140-1 Trifecta... 19-1 Stormy Liberal selection Zio Jo ran second to B-horse Unconquerablele Ken (10-1). Exacta paid 201-1

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

One thing that makes this handicap particularly interesting, is that Gulfstream Park's handicapper appears to have ignored the weight-for-age scale when assigning riding weights to the three-year-olds; Coiled, Dontsplashtepot and I Know I Know; though it is also possible that he has assessed these three to have performed to much higher ratings than what I have arrived at. Whatever the cause, the reasoning in this office is to drop all but one of these completely, and use the third one, Coiled, only to small stakes underneath in the Trifecta plan.

RISK MANAGER has been very consistent in this race this season and he is coming off good runs at Ellis Park, Kentucky Downs, Aqueduct and Churchill Downs, where he ran sixth to Echo Lane over 8.5 furlongs in November (when the pace was too slow for him). Prior to that effort, the 7yo son of Lookin at Lucky had notched up three straight wins. He won easily by 5 1/2 lengths from Alasdair over 8.5 furlongs, then he outstayed Gilded Craken to score by a neck over 10.5 furlongs at the demanding Kentucky Downs course, before catching **BELOUNI** to beat him by half a length over 8.5 furlongs on the inner track at Aqueduct. Backed late to go off favorite, he came with a strong run from well off the pace and won a bit cheekily. Risk Manager, who ran to **Globeform 106** at Kentucky Downs and to GF 105 at Aqueduct, is an incredibly versatile runner who has also won at the Fair Grounds. He clearly takes his racetrack with him and his off-the-pace running style makes it a logical move to try him in a marathon. This represents a big step up in trip of course, but that's the case also for Belouni and it will be fascinating to see which one will cope best with a 2-mile test. Trainer Mike Maker has been very successful in long distance turf races, and Risk Manager was fourth in the 12-furlong Connally Turf Cup back in 2023. Sufficient stamina is not ensured but he makes a lot of sense otherwise and morning line 3-1 is not a bad price for this contender.

BELOUNI, who was just behind the pace and pulling at Aqueduct, yet had energy left at the finish, *could* still be just as good a card over this distance. He has never raced over further than 9 furlongs and he is a son of Fast Company (who was a sharp juvenile) though there's plenty of stamina in the bottom half of his pedigree, and Jorge Abreu is a shrewd trainer with a 25% clip in stakes events. He claimed Belouni for \$40,000 from his former boss Chad Brown prior to running him against Risk Manager at Aqueduct. Belouni ran to **Globeform 104** in that 8.5-furlong event, getting caught late and beaten half a length. Note that he is now 2lbs better off at the weights against Risk Manager. If he settles into a good rhythm, and stays the trip, he has a chance. Belouni is out of Vienna View (who is by Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Dalakhani). A lightly raced maiden, she has also produced Vienna Woods, a daughter of high class miler Cacique who won over 15 furlongs and was second over 17 furlongs in France as a 5yo.

PADIDDLE, who was with Jorge Abreu when peaking over 11 and 12 furlongs at Gulfstream Park and Aqueduct in the spring, steps back up in trip after two disappointing outings in ordinary company over a mile at Delaware Park. Warrior Wayne, who beat him by a neck in August, has been well beaten in four starts since. Padiddle was much better when third both in the 12-furlong Pan American Stakes in March and in the 11-furlong Man O'War Stakes in May, both won by Far Bridge, who beat him 4 lengths and 6 lengths in these events. Padiddle returned **Globeform 101** in the Man O'War, and that's his best figure to date. He joined Andrew Simoff for the two starts at Delaware and is now trained by Elizabeth Dobles.

SUMMER CAUSE produced his best piece of form two starts back, checking in third behind Dripping Gold and Hardspun Reason in the six-runner Presious Passion Stakes over 12 furlongs at Monmouth Park. Keeping on from just off the slow pace, he went down by 1 1/4 lengths, having run to GF 99 when he beat the consistent yardstick Royal Luck by 1 1/2 lengths over 8.5 furlongs at Tampa Bay Downs back in April. His run in the Presious Passion, when he had last year's Jerkens Handicap winner Lord Eddard Stark behind him in fourth place, was slightly better. Dripping Gold and Hardspun Reason had previously been second and third behind Goldeneye in a good allowance heat at Colonial Downs, and the form is easy to assess. Summer Cause's poor effort in the 2-mile Forbes Memorial at Fair Hill in October, when he trailed throughout, was too bad to be true; it did not tell us anything about his stamina. His dam, Our Cause (Arch), was a maiden with just five starts (6.5 - 8.5 furlongs), while his second dam never raced and his third dam was an ordinary winner over 6 furlongs aged two and three. Interestingly, this is the family of Ken McPeek's talented 3yo filly Unmerited Favor, who we backed when she was a badly ridden fifth in the Jockey Club Oaks over 11 furlongs at Aqueduct in November. >>>

COILED improved to Globeform 95p when beating maiden winner Zevon and next out low weighted handicap winner Whiskeyinthejaro by 3/4 length and a length in an allowance race over 12 furlongs at Laurel Park in September, and he looks the only 3yo worth considering in this stamina test. Though it is pure guesswork whether he will stay, as the pace was slow (and he was pulling early on) when he won by diving through by the rail in the closing stages. He was just a few lengths behind the leaders for the most part of the trip, and had come from much further back when sixth, 4 lengths behind the stakes placed Early Adopter over 9.5 furlongs at Keeneland in April. Coiled was given a break from that run to his return over a mile at Colonial Downs in early September (last of eight, 5 1/2 lengths behind subsequent Showing Up Stakes winner Souper Forces, who is 3-for-3). A May foal, Coiled is the type to progress with age. His dam Laquesta is a daughter of Belmont Stakes winner Lemon Drop Kid. She won over 8 and 8.5 furlongs on the lawn. Coming from the family of Santa Anita Handicap winner Cupid, she has also produced Opus Forty Two (Mendelssohn), who won the 7-furlong Gasparilla Stakes and ran second in the 8.5-furlong Delaware Oaks.

CONCLUSION: Let's focus on Risk Manager and Belouni, with Summer Cause as the next choice; in a race where we can drop the three-year-olds. Possibly with exception of Coiled, who may be an improving sort and can be used underneath to small stakes. Padiddle's best form would make him a win contender but his more recent form is uninspiring. The win bet has to be Risk Manager, especially if we get 3-1, which seems generous; while the Trifecta plan can be based on him and Belouni fighting out the finish.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

ASTRONOMER's career best performance is his staying-on third in this event twelve months ago, when he improved to Globeform 112 and got up for third, beaten half a length and a neck behind our two A-horses, Mi Hermano Ramon and Redistricting. He had been hinting at such form a couple of times earlier and Del Mar is a track that suits him. The Simon Callaghan trainee has not been up to the same level this season but he ran well when fifth in the Wickerr Stakes over a mile at this venue in July, beaten 2 lengths behind ALMENDARES, who is now as much as 6lbs worse off at the weights. What's in the latter's favor, however, is that he has run two good races since, while Astronomer has been below form on his two most recent starts (one at Kentucky Downs, a track that was never going to suit him). These two have about an equal chance based on their 2025-form. After winning the Wickerr, Almendares ran second to subsequent Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Formidable Man in the Del Mar Mile, and third to another high class runner, Johannes, in the City of Hope Mile at Santa Anita. CABO SPIRIT was in the mix in both of those races, finishing a head behind Almendares in the Del Mar Mile and a head in front of him in the City of Hope, when spotting Almendares 2lbs. They meet at level weights this time.

SUMTER may prove too good for all though; if he repeats the form he came up with when winning his second Lure Stakes, well, then it will take a career best and then some from one of the others to deny him. He was very impressive as he won the Lure, run over a mile at Santa Anita in October; powering past the pace setting Goliad at the top of the lane and cruising away for comfortable 4-length win over St Anthony, who was coming off a sixth placed finish 5 lengths behind Epic Ride in the Mint Millions at Kentucky Downs. Having run to GF 111 when he was beaten just a head by the smart sprinter Motorious in the Hernandez Stakes last December, Sumter improved to Globeform 113 in the Lure Stakes. He had more up his sleeve passing the winning post and has been rated as a 5-length winner. He has never won over 8.5 furlongs but his sunning style suggests that this added distance won't be a problem - especially in a field without much speed signed on. He is coming off his career best run, he likes Del Mar, he is well drawn and the pace scenario is likely to be ideal; so, yes please, **let's have 6-1 if at all possible**. That's his morning line. We'll see how close it is to reality.

EL POTENTE was in great form at Santa Anita in the winter, when two nice wins made him a contender for the Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita in March, but he was scratched from that event and has not been seen since. He is thus coming off a nine-month break. Trainer Dan Blacker has a good record with layoff runners and he has also done really well in Graded stakes, so El Potente should be taken seriously in the Seabiscuit.

He improved race by race through three starts before he was stopped, winning twice while easily overcoming a wide post to be up with the pace - where he likes to be. He raced with great zest throughout in the one-mile Thunder Road Stakes, and kicked away to win the race by 3 lengths from Seal Team, who beat Air Force Red by 1 1/4 lengths for second place. El Potente was never given a hard time by his rider and he was value for more than the bare margin. His **Globeform 111p** did not seem likely to be the ceiling at the time; he could well prove to be a GF 114-115 performer but the question is whether he can step up on his previous best straight off the bench. He was third behind **SUMTER** and Mi Hermano Ramon when going for the Lure Stakes after a break last year and perhaps he will be needing the run this weekend.

CALL SIGN SEVEN, a 20-1 shot on the morning line, is a horse many will dismiss, but this lightly raced 4yo is actually quite an interesting contender. He has to overcome a couple of things here, mainly the layoff since March and the possibility of a slow pace (which would probably be the biggest problem) though there's little doubt that he is talented; and nobody can say that he's not going to be good enough to do well at this level. He certainly looked like he would be when he came from some 14 to 15 lengths off a strong pace to win a mile allowance heat at Santa Anita in February, and McCarthy could have found him an easier spot for the return. Call Sign Seven even had to negotiate some traffic coming down the lane when he caught the long time leader Jeweled Shillelag in the last jump and win by a nose. The runner-up, who won next time out, was tiring but it was still an unusual run by Call Sign Seven, who improved to Globeform 102p. He was not able to follow up when seventh, beaten 2 lengths behind Heart Headed (a good winner at Churchill last weekend), in a similar race a month later, but Call Sign Seven was compromised by a slow mid-section of the race and he did well under the circumstances. This step up in distance will suit him though Del Mar might not be ideal, with the short stretch, but Call Sign Seven should be included in the Trifecta plans. Assigned 116lbs, he is set to be ridden by Ricardo Gonzalez, who did 117lbs not too long ago. Add any overweight pounds to the horse's ranking figure to get the comparison right. >>> CALL SIGN SEVEN WON AT 68-1

CONCLUSION: Sumter's win last month was very easy; he improved his rating without having a hard race. He has not been the most reliable of runners and he failed in the Seabiscuit after winning the Lure last year but he set the pace that day (when the first three home all came from out of it) and his current form is better. **6-1 is a great price**. If we get 4-1 or better then this race is one where the win bet should be the main bet.

Trifecta players face more of a challenge. We would need one B-horse to make a sensible plan. El Potente can be used as a brave single B-horse on his return. Cabo Spirit and Almendares both take good recent form to the table and probably have as good a chance, and Astronomer is top ranked - but El Potente is the one would might improve. Call Sign Seven is the longshot play. At 20-1 he's worth an across the board / each way wager. CALL SIGN SEVEN WON AT 68-1

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

This race looks so wide open and it might be tempting to bypass it all together; then again it's the type of turf race that it's tempting to have a crack at, to try and solve the puzzle; something that probably can't be done successfully without a bit of betting luck thrown in; and when a field is as evenly matched as this one luck in running will be vital for the runners. A bad trip or a poor rider call here and there will be too many good enough to take advantage to even think about making it a winning day.

PROCTOR STREET makes a fair bit of appeal, even over 9 furlongs; a trip she has yet to try and a trip that could stretch her stamina. It's hard to assess her stamina limit. She looked like she was at the end of it when third a length behind G1 winner Dynamic Pricing in the Perfect Sting Stakes over a mile at Saratoga's inner track in late August, then won a good allowance heat over 8.5 furlongs at Keeneland in October, when she raced very much like a horse ready to take yet another step up in distance. She came from well off the pace to beat **SHE'S LOOKIN LUCKY**, who held second by a neck from A Lilac Rolla. Proctor Street won an allowance race also prior to the Perfect Sting and she has been very consistent this season. Her dam, Proctor's Ledge, was a G1 placed miler capable of Globeform 117, and she returned GF 113+ when second in the 9-furlong Hillsborough Stakes as a 4yo. Proctor Street seems to take after her mum and she has a good chance of winning the Cardinal. Her **6-1 morning line looks too big**, even in a tricky contest.

MIWA tops the ranking but that's based on her best 12-furlong form at Kentucky Downs, where she won an allowance heat and ran third in the Ladies Marathon (3 1/2 lengths behind Stellify, who was in great form at the time). Miwa has since disappointed over the same distance in the Dowager at Keeneland (slowly run race on a yielding course) and she now drops down in distance while not dropping all that much in class. She raced from off the pace at Kentucky Downs and may find this 9-furlong trip too short.

DUVET DAY has also run well over 12 furlongs but she won this event last year and is much more flexible when in comes to trips. She is at her best when coming from well off the pace, however, and there's no guarantee of strong fractions here. She closed in well to get up for a game 3/4-length win from **SHE'S LOOKIN LUCKY** twelve months ago, running to **Globeform 106** in the process. Thoroughly consistent, she ran back to the same mark to be fourth, 2 lengths behind Charlene's Dream, in the 9.5-furlong Beverly D Stakes at Colonial in August, and was almost as good when fourth behind Stellify, Way to Be Marie and **MIWA** in the 12-furlong Ladies Marathon at Kentucky Downs in September. Miwa was a length better then but it's likely that the tables will be turned over 9 furlongs. Like Miwa, Duvet Day was also well below her best in the pedestrian Dowager Stakes last time out. She could take the Cardinal back to back.

PIN UP BETTY also comes into the reckoning. Her best level of form, and she has produced that in four of her five races this season, is good enough to give her a winning chance. Her only blip came at Kentucky Downs, a course that does not suit every horse - far from it. She opened her campaign with a good runner-up effort in the Churchill Downs Distaff Turf Mile in early May, when she lost by just a neck to Simply in Front; and she is now coming off a close fifth behind the same rival in the First Lady Stakes over a mile at Keeneland. In between these runs, Pin Up Betty took the 8.5-furlong Mint Julep Stakes (beating subsequent Beverly D winner Charlene's Dream by 1 1/2 lengths) and the Anchorage Stakes over 9 furlongs, both at Churchill Downs. Coming from off the pace, as is normally her style, she beat **DUVET DAY** by 3/4 length in the Anchorage, and Pin Up Betty is just a pound worse off at the weights here. With a strong record both over this course and at this distance, she's a win contender; but 5-2 makes her too short on the morning line.

AWESOME CZECH is a very interesting contender and, at **a massive 15-1 morning line**, she sticks out as the value bet we simply must have. She has been showing progressive form through her four most recent starts, from a narrow allowance win over a mile at Saratoga in July, when she ran to GF 100, to a very determined win in the 8.5-furlong Ticonderoga Stakes at Aqueduct in late October. Travelling with zest just off the pace, she came with a smooth run to lead inside the last half-furlong, and ran on to deny the late charging Gallant Greta and win by a neck. Awesome Czech, who had won the Yaddo and been third in the Athenia previously, improved to **Globeform 106** in the Ticonderoga. That makes her a player in the Cardinal and she could actually improve again. There's nothing flashy about her but this daughter of Meldelssohn is all racehorse and she gives her best every time she's got a number cloth under her saddle. Note that her Ticonderoga runner-up, Gallant Greta, won an allowance race by almost four lengths two weeks later, easily beating Nonna Lynne, a rival who was coming off a win in similar company on her preceding start. >>>

VIVE VEUVE (two good wins at Saratoga and now coming off a third in the Dowager; but inexplicably short as 3-1 on the morning line) and **STYLISH SUE** (career best when making all to score over 8.5 furlongs in a late seasonal debut at this venue on November 8) are also worth considering as Trifecta horses, though it's hard to see either of them ending up in the winners' circle.

CONCLUSION: Proctor Street gets a narrow vote and that's not only because 6-1 is too big; she been so reliable and if it's correct that she wants more ground (as it seemed last time out), then this lightly raced, and well bred, daughter of Street Sense has a good chance. Sorting out the others is anything but easy and we can't have more than two B-horses in an open race like this. The two that make sense are 15-1 shot Awesome Czech (who is on an upward curve and not too pace dependent) and the more accomplished 5-2 shot Pin Up Betty (who wants pace and has to give weight; but who has made her presence felt against better runners than these). How to play the Trifecta? Bravely; Going for at least one of those two (preferably both) to hit the board, and mix in as many others as possible. Awesome Czech is the value W&S / EW bet.



GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

HEY NAY NAY ran out of steam after setting the pace in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, fading right down to tenth place in the 14-runner field. We know he is a lot better than that, this is big drop in class, and he must have a good chance of gaining his third stakes success of the season. After winning over 5 furlongs at Santa Anita on his debut, the strapping son of No Nay Never went for the Tyro Stakes over the same distance at Monmouth Park. He did not have much to beat but he ran them right off the racetrack to win by 7 lengths and earn **Globeform 103p**. He was pushed out by his rider but not at all given a hard ride. There was more left in the tank as he passed the winning post - and that was the case also when he followed up with a solid win in the Del Mar Juvenile Turf over a mile in early September. Breaking very fast, Hey Nay Nay went straight to the lead and he never looked back. He won the race under a hand ride, beating the erratic Plutarch comfortably by 1 1/2 lengths. Hey Nay Nay ran to the same rating as in the Tyro and Plutarch seemed to frank the form by running third to Intrepido in the American Pharoah Stakes, beaten just 3/4 length; though as it turned out Intrepido had no chance at the Breeders' Cup - and on the same day Plutarch disappointed in third place behind Conducted and **PROTON** in the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Stakes. Perhaps the Del Mar Juvenile Turf form wasn't so good after all? Still, his best form is the best form going into the Demille Stakes and it's likely that Hey Nay Nay will be fairly hard to beat. >>>

UNRIVALED TIME was very impressive when trotting up as a well backed favorite on his second start, taking a mile maiden at Santa Anita with a strong run from some five to six lengths off the pace to win comfortably by 4 1/2 lengths from John Metcalfe, who was a head better than the third placed Columnist. Columnist had been third also in the race where Unrivaled Time made his debut; with the latter back in fifth place after a slow start and a troubled run. He closed in late also on that occasion, passing the winning post 2 3/4 lengths behind the winner, Third Beer. Unrivaled Time could have been closer with a clean run and the form was given a nice boost when Third Beer took second in the Zuma Beach Stakes next time out; beaten only a length to the subsequent Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Stark Contrast. So, there you have it, Unrivaled Time ran with great promise behind a stakes quality performer first time out, and he crushed a decent field at the second time of asking, winning for fun with at least another length up his sleeve. His runner-up, John Metcalfe, ran second to Michael McCarthy's talented newcomer Smoovin Saturday next time out. Put up as an 8-1 chance on the morning line, Unrivaled Time is a very tempting bet. He ran to Globeform 99p at Santa Anita, making him the joint top ranked runner (as Hey Nay Nay has to give him 4lbs), he will improve and he is likely to get a decent pace to close into. By top class stallion Not This Time, he is a son of Margot Machance. She won three times and ran fourth twice in graded stakes over 9 furlongs on the lawn as a 3yo. She has also produced Margot's Boy, a winner of seven races who ran second in the Del Mar Derby.

PROTON and **CARO BUONO** (who ran to GF 90 already in France in the spring) ran second and fifth respectively in the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Stakes over a mile here at Del Mar on Breeders' Cup Friday. The race was won well by Conducted, who completed the distance in 1:36:4, as much as 1.8 seconds slower than Gstaad's winning time in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. Times are not too important in turf races, especially over a mile and further, but this does tell us that the pace was not great and the late kick perhaps not great either. Proton, winner of the Laurel Futurity in September, improved to **Globeform 98**, while Caro Buono ran to GF 94, having recorded **Globeform 96** when fifth to Stark Contrast in the Zuma Beach Stakes four weeks earlier. Proton is more likely to improve again, as Caro Buono is getting exposed now, and Graham Motion's contender probably has the best chance of these two.

CONCLUSION: There's no hard evidence, but Unrivaled Time's maiden win suggested that he is a stakes winner waiting to happen. He is definitely open to improvement, and the weight pull against Hey Nay Nay, who *may* be becoming exposed and *could* be feeling the effects of having been involved at the top level a month ago, is not insignificant. Another factor is that Hey Nay Nay might get pace pressure in a race that's run to suit Unrivaled Time. This does look like a two horse race, and it's easy to side with Unrivaled Time. He has a lot of upside; the only worry would be that he has not run at Del Mar before. His **8-1 morning line looks to good to be true**, let's just hope it isn't. Proton and Caro Buono are the obvious Trifecta fillers; if one more is wanted then it might be the Irish import Iriseach; he improved markedly when beating Army Man and Medici over this mile in late October.

Players planning to get involved in the late Pick 5 / 4 pools should note that Army Man and Medici are both set to run in the last race on this card, as is Honey's Choice (who was second to Brigante last time out).
