

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

FAR BRIDGE ran to GF 114+ when winning this event on his seasonal debut last year, and he has a good chance of repeating this weekend. Coming off a layoff is hardly a cause for concern, he is the top ranked horse in the field, he is 4-for-4 at Gulfstream Park and 12 furlongs is his game. He won by a neck from **CORRUPTION** last year and he is now 6lbs better off with that rival, and with **PADIDDLE**, who checked in third beaten 4 lengths. Far Bridge continued to perform to that level in May / June / July, though his form took a dip in August and September, when he was below par in the Sword Dancer at Saratoga and the Turf Classic at Aqueduct (where he was a respectable fourth though).

After his Pan American win, the Miguel Clement trainee followed up in the Man O'War Stakes at Aqueduct, where he was also odds-on and beat Anglophile by a length (**PADIDDLE** once more third). These wins set him up for a crack at the Manhattan Stakes at Saratoga - a race that was switched to the inner track and shortened from 10 to 9 furlongs. That was never going to suit him and Far Bridge impressed in defeat that day, taking third, beaten only a head and a neck behind Deterministic and Integration. Deterministic advertised the form by winning the Fourstardave on his next start. Far Bridge produced GF 115+ in the Manhattan, only a length below his career best, **Globeform 117** recorded in 2024. He next confirmed his well being with an effortless 3-length win over El Rezeen in the four-runner Bowling Green Stakes in July, a race used purely as a prep for his attempt at winning the Sword Dancer back to back, something that did not work out. Far Bridge is the one to beat in this edition of the Pan American. Unless one of the others improve (which is unlikely) he can win this contest by running to GF 108-109. We can't expect him to be 100% fit in what is simply a starting point to a new campaign, but will he need to be? Probably not. One thing to bear in mind, however, is that this horse not only prefers to race by the rail, he more or less demands it, and he is drawn in gate seven. New rider Flavien Prat, in red-hot form at the minute, can be trusted to work out a good trip though, and there's not much speed to his inside. The main player in that respect is right by the rail though; last year's runner-up Corruption.

BROTHA KENY is an interesting runner in this turf marathon. He has never raced on the lawn before (winless through his first four runs on Tapeta at Turfway Park) and he has never tried further than 9.5 furlongs. So what is this talented 4yo doing in the Pan American? He is intriguing in more ways than one this horse. Sold for \$550,000 in December last year, he is a son of Mo Town, who won the Hollywood Derby on turf at Del Mar, but his dam, Raramuri Princess was a maiden placed six times while running up bills at Mountaineer Park. She's done better as a broodmare and is also the dam of Concealed Carry, who was third in a Listed race on Woodbine's Tapeta track at two and won a minor stakes over a mile on dirt at Parx at five.

We have no way of knowing whether Brotha Keny will act on turf, or stay this trip, but trainer Jose D'Angelo probably does; and note that he is 27% with his dirt to turf runners. That's more than twice as good as his overall record in 2026. Brotha Keny is second on the ranking in the Pan American and he should be respected. He ran his best race to date when beating West Virginia Derby winner and Clark Stakes third Chunk of Gold by 1 1/2 lengths in the Bourbon Flight Stakes over 9.5 furlongs at Churchill Downs last September. It was only a three-runner race and Brotha Keny went gate to wire, but the final time was decent enough. Meeting older horses over 8.5 at Keeneland a month later, he was then held up for a late run and got up for fourth, 2 1/2 lengths behind Generous Tipper. It was a stakes quality allowance heat and >>>



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Brotha Keny performed to GF 106, not too far off his **Globeform 110** recorded in the Bourbon Flight. Another month into the fall he took the Zia Park Derby; this time coming from further back and getting a half-length verdict over Zero Sugar. Brotha Keny did not need his best to win that event. He went for the Pegasus World Cup as his seasonal debut this year - a somewhat optimistic move that did not enhance his reputation. Let's forget about that last placed finish. He is so much better than that showing and what makes him fascinating in the Pan American is that he is very adaptable. He can be sent to the lead or he can be waited with at the back. Stepping up to this trip may seem extreme but 9.5 furlongs on dirt at Churchill Downs is also a stamina test, and this event might not get more than an average pace. Just a month ago, the mare Just Basking - whose best previous form was a third in the 10-furlong Alabama Stakes on dirt - won the Very One Stakes over 11 furlongs on turf. Take Far Bridge out of the Pan American field and Brotha Keny is facing lesser lights than the best of her rivals.

CORRUPTION, like Far Bridge coming off a break, is in a perfect position for his prominent running style. He ran to **Globeform 107** when second to Far Bridge in this event 12 months ago and he repeated that rating twice later in the season, but he is 6lbs worse off with Far Bridge this time; making this a tougher task against him - but Corruption can beat the rest. He is not in the same league as the favorite here, though a tactical advantage always matters and he could actually be capable of giving Far Bridge a fight; particularly if Far Bridge ends up being stuck wide. Corruption will probably be sent to the lead, save ground and try to take them all the way. He ran up to his best also when winning a good allowance race over 11 furlongs at Saratoga in July and when third to Ole Crazy Bone in the 12-furlong Kentucky Downs Turf Cup in September.

DASHMAN is also in with a chance of hitting the board, and he may be the horse who holds the key to the pace of the race - as he has been prominent in a couple of his best races. Him pressing on from gate 6 could deny Far Bridge (7) a dream trip just off of the leader. Dashman ran to **Globeform 106** when beating Cash Equity by a nose to win the W L McKnight Stakes over 12 furlongs at Gulfstream Park in January '25, when he quickly managed to get a good spot as third from post 12. He has raced just twice since; for a respectable seventh placed effort under top weight in the 10-furlong Kentucky Downs Turf Preview at Ellis Park, and he fourth behind Cruise the Nile, Burnham Square and Chapman's Peak over 8.5 furlongs over this course in late February. That distance is too short for Dashman, and he seems sure to move forward this time.

ECHO LANE, a game and consistent performer, ran his best race to date when beaten just half a length by Grand Sonata in the 11-furlong Mac Diarmida Stakes here at Gulfstream Park a month ago. Stepping markedly up in distance, he was ridden up with the pace and he fought on really well when Grand Sonata - who has more stamina - came with a winning charge close home. Echo Lane performed to **Globeform 105**, marginally better than his previous best (GF 103 when winning over 8.5 fur. at Churchill Downs). Going from the Mac Diarmida to the Pan American is a very common and it's easy to understand why his connections give this race a shot, but the extra furlong might find him out.

CONCLUSION: Far Bridge is impossible to oppose. Favorites like this, coming back after long breaks and facing race fit rivals, are often vulnerable; but the case here is that his most likely threat, Corruption, is also returning from a layoff, while the second ranked Brotha Keny is making his turf debut and trying a new distance. Below those two on the ranking we have Dashman (who is fairly exposed) and Echo Lane (who may not care much for 12 furlongs) so, yes, Far Bridge has to be a clear cut selection. If he runs like he did in this event last year he wins the rac. Trifecta players should consider using him on top with Corruption as the second key in 2nd and 3rd; though a 12-line ticket where we play the favorite over the four others in the selection box also makes sense. Brotha Keny will probably be the one offering some value.
