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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

LAGYNOS produced his career best when winning the Tapit Stakes over an extended mile at Kentucky Downs in late August. The 4yo son of Kantharos improved to Globeform 114 as he ran out an easy 5 1/4-length winner from Ohana Honor, who pipped Cameo Performance by a nose for second. Breaking well from the outside post in a nine-runner field, Lagynos was always prominent and he dominated in the home stretch. The further he went the better he looked, and the win made him favorite for the one-mile Mint Millions Invitational over the same course nine days later. The Steve Asmussen trainee put up another good performance in the big race, but had to settle for second, 2 lengths behind EPIC RIDE (who is expected to scratch from the River City). A really tough and consistent sort, Lagynos has a good chance based on ratings here - but will he appreciate the step up to 9 furlongs? There's a fair bit of pace signed on - even with Epic Ride defecting - so whoever wins this River City will be a horse that truly gets the trip.

Frankie Dettori, who has been named as the rider for Lagynos, announced last week that his ride in the Breeders' Cup Mile would be his last in North America before he heads to South America, where he will end his career. He has not been named to ride any other horses on Saturday.

EPIC RIDE has also been <u>entered for the Friday feature at Churchill Downs</u>, and his trainer John Ennis has said that the plan is to run in that race, rather than in the River City. This preview will be updated Saturday if the running plan for this horse changes.

WOLFIE'S DYNAGHOST, a strong front-runner who tackled 9 furlongs when running to a career best **Globeform 114** (a figure he ran to three times also in 2023) to win the Prince George's County Stakes at Laurel Park in June, must be a live contender for this event. He won the race comfortably by 4 1/2 lengths from Crystal Quest, who was closer to the winner when fifth to Fort Washington in the Dinner Party Stakes at Pimlico on his preceding start. Prior to that, Crystal Quest had won a minor stakes and, with Fort Washington going on to win the Arlington Million, the Dinner Party offers a positive formlink. That was also the race where our 34-1 Sycamore Stakes winner Desvio was spotted as a horse to note. [end of commercial...]

Back to Wolfie's Dynaghost: He next ran in a 9.5-furlong allowance race at Saratoga, where he was odds-on favorite but disappointed badly and was second behind Goldeneye. It wasn't the added half-furlong that beat him; he simply had an off day. He bounced back to win a valuable handicap over 8.5 furlongs at Colonial Downs in September, beating Sky's Not Falling and Wow Whata Summer with ease. They both ran well in allowance company next time out; Wow Whata Summer winning and Sky's Not Falling rruning a good second. Wolfie's Dynaghost did not need to be at his best to win on that occasion; going off at 1/10, he enjoyed a soft lead and strolled home by 3 3/4 lengths. The River City will be a much tougher race and he's unlikely to be handed a soft lead here, but Wolfie's Dynaghost is in fine form and he is good enough to beat these and 10-1 morning line is too big about this contender.

CHASING THE CROWN is the one that makes most appeal as the selection though. This Mike Maker trainee has raced only twice in 2025, on both occasions producing Globeform 113 - his career best - , and there's a lot to like about him in the River City. Chasing the Crown showed consistent form also last year, when he rounded his season off by winning a stakes quality allowance race here at Churchill Downs in November, coming from off the pace to nail Wadsworth by a head on the wire. Chasing the Crown improved to GF 111 on the day and he moved up another notch when taking third in the 9-furlong Pegasus World Cup Turf 12 weeks later. Going off at 64-1 he overcame a wide post and finished strongly from off the pace and reached the winning post only 1 1/2 lengths behind Spirit of St. Louis, who beat Integration by a neck. Spirit of St. Louis has since won the Turf Classic at Churchill Downs (beating MERCANTE) and Integration has been placed in another three G1 events since. >>>





It's been a good month; selective betting is paying off

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Chasing the Crown had high class performers like Mi Hermano Ramon, Fort Washington, Win for the Money, Nations Pride and Formidable Man behind him in the Pegasus Turf, and he proved that it was no fluke on his next start. It took some time before we got see him again, however; he had been off for over seven months when making a winning return in a valuable handicap at Kentucky Downs in late August. With \$300,000 up for grabs, the mile event drew a very competitive field, with Mountain Bear as the 3-1 favorite, slightly shorter than Chasing the Crown's odds. Chasing the Crown came out best; held up for a late charge by Tyler Gaffalione, he powered past horses up the straight and won readily by 1 1/2 lengths from Lambeth, who he was spotting 4lbs. Mountain Bear was third, 4 lengths further adrift. He is far from reliable these days, but Lambeth was a Listed winner in the spring and smart runners like Gigante and Emmanuel (stakes winner since; runs on Friday) were further back and well beaten. Chasing the Crown ran every bit as well at Kentucky Downs as he did in the Pegasus at Gulfstream, and if he runs like that again he will prove hard to beat this weekend. He ran well twice over 8.5 furlongs at this venue last year, he has improved since and 9 furlongs suits him better; we also know that he can fire straight off the bench (it seems to be when he's at his best) and he is likely to get the right pace scenario for his running style. Chasing the Crown is the morning line favorite but 7-2 is actually not a bad price.

ENCINO switched from dirt to turf three starts back, and won the Schuster Stakes over 8.5 furlongs at Horseshoe Indiana in early July; taking the race by 1 1/4 lengths from Runaway Storm as the 11-10 favorite. He improved again, albeit marginally, when third behind Beach Gold and **EPIC RIDE** in the Kentucky Downs Preview Turf Mile at Ellis Park two months later. Encino performed to **Globeform 111** there, and he did not need to be anywhere near that level when winning the Presque Isle Downs Mile on Tapeta in September. He broke slowly but showed that he does not need the lead (not in that sort of company anyway) as he came through from the back to win readily by 1 3/4 lengths from Grounded. He has been setting the pace or pressing it in most of his races though and that is his preferred style. Having run second to **MERCANTE** in the 9-furlong Kentucky Cup Classic on Tapeta in the spring, he stays this distance but his best form has come over shorter.

TAKING CANDY is a very interesting longshot; but I'm not so sure he will be as big as his 8-1 morning line when the gates open. After all, he was 8-1 for the G1 Turf Classic here at Churchill Downs back in May; when he was coming off a win in the 9-furlong Fair Grounds Stakes. He did not run well in the Turf Classic but the lightly raced 5yo son of Twirling Candy did so much better on his next outing; the 8.5-furlong Wise Dan Stakes in late June (also at Churchill). Staying on well inside the final furlong after having been ridden a few lengths off a slow pace, he checked in second just 3/4 length behind his G2 winning barnmate Brilliant Berti, with **LAGYNOS** a nose behind him in third. Taking Candy carried 2lbs more than his nearest rivals and he improved to **Globeform 112** with that effort. Cutting back in distance, he went for the Kentucky Downs Preview Mile at Ellis Park in early August; ran well again but *as* well, to be a 2-length fifth, beaten by Beach Gold, **EPIC RIDE**, **ENCINO** and **MERCANTE**. So why fancy Taking Candy to come out best of these in the River City? Reasons: The return to Churchill Downs, the longer distance, the likely pace scenario, and the weight swing against Mercante, who is now a pound worse off at the weights (and has been well below form in two subsequent races). Another thing worth considering is that it's not impossible that Taking Candy, who has had some issues and raced only 12 times, could improve.

MERCANTE was busy, and very productive, in the early part of the year, but the signs are that he has lost his form. He drops back down in class, having run in the Coolmore Turf Mile at Keeneland in early October, when he beat just two home as a 60-1 outsider. That was in high class company but he would have been a lot closer if he had run up to his best; and he had been below par also when a well beaten fourth behind Ole Crazy Bone in the Kentucky Turf Cup at Kentucky Downs a month earlier, a race that fell just over a month after a better effort in the Kentucky Downs Preview Mile at Ellis Park, where he was fourth (see **TAKING CANDY** for more on that race). His best form is the runner-up effort behind Spirit of St. Louis in the Turf Classic in May, run over this course and distance, so the River City should suit him but, with questionable form and a tough weight, Mercante makes limited appeal. He is likely to be part of or pressing the early pace.

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CONCLUSION: Chasing the Crown is the logical selection, in what is otherwise quite an open looking race. Wolfie's Dynaghost, who may try to lead all the way, and Taking Candy, whose running style is quite the opposite, are interesting contenders at good odds. In using these two as the B-horses, it's asking a lot to get them both on the board; as if the pace favors the one it probably won't suit the other - but playing Trifectas requiring one of these to fill second or third may be the solution. With a lot of luck, a lot of luck, it could create a bullseye win, though if one of them gets into the top three we should collect. Provided Chasing the Crown wins! Horses not in the selections box worth including underneath; Quatrocento (career best two back and respectable in G1 last out; but may defect), Mercante (*could* bounce back), Corruption (a cut below but course / distance suits and he is consistent) and English Chunnel (in-form and may improve again).
