## GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

**DESTINO D'ORO** has the best form in the book and she sets the standard in this Oaks, but she is also a runner coming off two subpar efforts; one that could probably be explained by running over an unsuitable course (at Kentucky Downs), the other not so easy to excuse, other than to assume that her form had taken a dip and / or there was something amiss on the day. She finished last in the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland in October, and now returns after a two-month break since that run. If she gets back to her best she will be hard to beat in the Tropical Park Oaks, though there is the adaptability factor to consider. This course is different to Churchill Downs (where she won an allowance heat from well off the pace) and Ellis Park, where she took the Pucker Up with a prominent run. She ran improved to **Globeform 105** when winning the 9-furlong Pucker Up in early August, beating Hereforagoodtime comfortably by 3 3/4 lengths. They met again in the Dueling Grounds Oaks at Kentucky Downs, where Hereforagoodtime ran third (beaten exactly the same margin by Fionn) but Destino d'Oro was only sixth.

Interestingly, Admit - who was third to Destino d'Oro at Ellis Park - also ran well to be fourth in Dueling Grounds Oaks and she has since won the Valley View Stakes at Keeneland, so there's no doubt; the Pucker Up form was solid. A repeat of that run would make her hard to beat.

**SUPA SPEED** has joined Brian Lynch from John Sadler and this is definitely an interesting contender. The daughter of Justify did well on the lawn in California last year, running second to the smart filly Thought Process in the Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf and third to Casalu in the Blue Norther at Santa Anita. After than she won an allowance race over a mile, before being switched to dirt in the four-runner Santa Ysabel Stakes. Bob Baffert's Maysam, who was receiving 2lbs, but the better of Supa Speed, but only by a nose and they drew 6 1/2 lengths clear of Howlin. Maysam has not raced since but Howlin went on to be second in the Summer Stakes, win an allowance heat, then run fourth in the Torrey Pines and third in the Zenyatta. Supa Speed shipped to Keeneland for the Ashland Stakes in April; made no real impact there but wasn't disgraced either, as she checked in sixth behind gate to wire winner La Cara. This will be her first run since but she won on her debut at two, Lynch has a good record with layoff runners (and with first runs with new horses in the barn), and Supa Speed probably has a winning chance.

**AND ONE MORE TIME** made a satisfactory comeback when winning an allowance race over a mile at Woodbine in September, not having raced since winning the Natalma Stakes over the same course and distance 12 months earlier. She was in the first two throughout in the Natalma, which was only her third start and the first on turf, and held on by a neck from her barnmate Vixen, who was half a length in front of another Mark Casse runner, Nitrogen. Nitrogen became one of the best 3yo fillies this year and Vixen has also done really well. The 2024 Natalma may have looked like Casse workout but it was a good race. And One More Time jumped right up to **Globeform 101p** with that performance, and she returned GF 98+ as she beat Shotgun Wedding as an odds-on favorite two months ago. Casse has had her nominated to some stakes that were stronger than the Tropical Park Oaks, but waited for this. Whether that's a good or a bad sign is impossible to say; it may simply have been a decision made with a view to the filly's early season campaign in 2026. Her late seasonal bow looked a bit workmanlike on the day but Shotgun Wedding won the Ontario Damsel on her next start and was then fifth 2 1/2 lengths behind Pondering in the Bessarabian Stakes (Pondering runs in the Inaugural Stakes at Turfway Park today). And One More Time must be respected here. She has form making her one of the highest ranked runners, and she can improve.

**CRAFTY COLLECTOR** won the 8.5-furlong Cellars Shiraz Stakes at Gulfstream Park at 61-1 in late October, improving to **Globeform 98** as she came from off the pace to beat **MISCHIEF IN MOTION** by a length. Crafty Collector had previously won an allowance race and run sixth in the Ginger Punch on the Tapeta, while Mischief in Motion was coming off a solid win in the Christina Stakes over 9 furlongs at Delaware Park in September, when she made all at a slow pace to win by 3 1/2 lengths from Don't Jinx It. Don't Jinx It franked that form by running third behind the classy duo Fionn and Laurelin in the Jockey Club Oaks on her next start, but Mischief if Motion undoubtedly got away with a soft lead at Delaware. It was the opposite in the Cellars Shiraz, where the pace was hot and she was badly ridden; sent hard to a clear lead going into the home turn, she was always going to be vulnerable, and Crafty Collection caught her without too much fuss. **RAMSEY POND** also closed in rapidly and got third, with **JALILA** fourth >>>

>>> and **NOSLEEPTILBROOKLYN** sixth. Mischief in Motion is now 3lbs better off with Crafty Collector and Ramsey Pond is 2lbs better off. The latter could well turn out to do best of these three on Saturday. Her trainer Saffie Joseph Jr almost managed Cellars Shiraz double when In Our Time ran first then second in these races last year.

**IT AIN'T TWO** ran to **Globeform 100** when beaten just a length in fourth place behind Breeders' Cup winner Shisospicy (who has improved in leaps and bounds since) in the Limestone Stakes over 5 furlongs at Keeneland back in April, and this Riley Mott trainee has been fairly consistent since; but GF 96 is the best she has achieved outside of sprint distances; she ran to that mark when third to Candy Quest in the Ontario Colleen over a mile at Woodbine in July. This 8.5-furlong race will probably get a good pace and her stamina is likely to be tested.

**RAMSEY POND** caught the eye with a late charge when third in the Cellars Shiraz last time out and she can be expected move forward with that prep run under belt. Winless in 7 starts at this, her home venue, she is better suited by courses with less emphasis on speed, but she can hit the board. She ran her best race to date (**Globeform 97p**) when winning an allowance heat over 8.5 furlongs at Keeneland in April (beating Aterradora by 1 1/4 lengths), and was subsequently rested almost four months leading up to a valuable mile race at Kentucky Downs, where she was a game second to Mo Fox Givin despite having been very worked up and edgy in the preliminaries.

**CONCLUSION:** Destino d'Oro was on an upward curve when sent to Kentucky Downs, where she was odds-on despite the fact that her more accomplished barnmate Fionn (who won the race) was also in the field. Drawing a line through that result, and her dull run at Keeneland, and she is hard to oppose. Not impossible; but let's say 'a bit' hard to oppose. She gets a narrow vote over And One More Time, who clearly is a talented filly with potential, and Supa Speed, now representing the red hot Lynch barn and with solid results on her CV. Going with recent form, the first three home in the Cellars Shiraz are chosen as C-horses.
