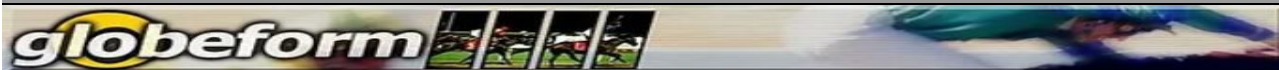

Globeform ratings are expressed in pounds. The "Rank" column shows the horse best in at the weights based on Globeform ratings on top, with other horses ranked down in pounds. For example; rank figure 6 tells us that the horse is 6lbs below the top ranked horse. Length values: 5-6 furlongs: 3lbs per length. 7 fur: 2.5lbs. 8 - 11 fur: 2lbs. 12 fur: 1.5lbs

Globeform rating with a "p" attached = this was the horse's best rating to date and the horse is likely to improve
Globeform rating with a "+" = this was not its best rating but the horse ran better than the rating suggests.

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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

BURNHAM SQUARE keeps on rolling and he has become a really exciting turf performer. Trainer Ian Wilkes said after the gelding's Elkhorn Stakes stroll that he would race him into top shape before major events coming up later in the season, and he went for the Louisville Stakes at Churchill Downs in May, when Burnham Square gained another effortless win, beating **DANCIN IN D'ANILE** by 4 3/4 lengths over 12 furlongs. Repeating **Globeform 120p**, he showed that his impressive Elkhorn performance was no fluke. Cutting back to 11 furlongs in the Chorleywood will not be an issue and he cannot be opposed.

He moved up to a new level when winning the Elkhorn Stakes over 12 furlongs at Keeneland in April. He came home 9 3/4-length in front of last year's Sycamore Stakes winner Desvio. This win was no big surprise. Burnham Square had made a good impression on his seasonal debut at Gulfstream Park in February, when he finished second behind gate to wire winner Cruise the Nile in a stakes quality allowance race over 8.5 furlongs, which is too short for Burnham Square. Next-out winner **CHAPMAN'S PEAK** was third and Cruise the Nile enhanced the form by winning the Henry Clark Stakes comfortably at Laurel Park on his next start.

Burnham Square won the Blue Grass Stakes and Holly Bull Stakes last year but a turf career was mapped out after he lost in a photo finish against the heavy favorite Wimbledon Hawkeye in the Nashville Derby at Kentucky Downs in the summer. He stayed on really well at the end of the 10.5-furlong trip at Kentucky Downs and almost managed to catch Wimbledon Hawkeye, who held on to win by a head. The two were well clear and Burnham Square returned GF 113, the same rating he had achieved when beaten half a length by East Avenue in the Matt Winn Stakes at Churchill Downs in June. That run came after a sixth placing in the Kentucky Derby and before a fifth placing in the Haskell Invitational. His finest hour as a 3yo came in the Blue Grass Stakes over 9 furlongs at Keeneland. That performance, worth GF 111p, was a case of silencing some critics after a disappointing fourth in the Fountain of Youth Stakes; when he was a beaten 2-1 favorite. The reason for that price was an impressive win in the Holy Bull Stakes a month earlier. Looking back on the Fountain of Youth result today we see that finishing fourth was better than it might have appeared to be at the time. The race was won by Sovereignty. When Burnham Square took the Holy Bull, he did so by beating Tappan Street - and that colt went on to get the better of Sovereignty in the Florida Derby.

DANCIN IN DA'NILE improved on his best form in 2025 when running second to **BURNHAM SQUARE** in the Louisville Stakes over 12 furlongs at Churchill Downs in May. He had no chance with the winner but a game finish saw him beating **ECHO LANE** by a neck for the place. It was actually a somewhat cozy neck and Dancin in Da'nile must have a chance of maintaining the superiority. He traveled well in mid-pack from the outset in the Louisville, but was tapped for toe and dropped back to last when the pace quickened around the home turn, then stayed on by far the best of the beaten horses coming down the lane. Echo Lane enjoyed the run of the race, as he sat just behind Freedom's Way, who set a steady pace (but dropped back in the home straight). The Gail Cox trainee ran to **Globeform 106** in the Louisville, his first start since November, when he was a beaten favorite in allowance company at Woodbine in Toronto - where he had run a good race to get fourth in the Canadian International over 12 furlongs a month earlier; staying on well from the back he passed the winning post 2 1/4 lengths behind Euro raider Silawi and returned GF 104 on that occasion, the same mark he had run to when third to Haunted Dream in the Singspiel Stakes on his previous start. This battled hardened son of Pioneer of the Nile was even better back in 2024, when he produced **Globeform 108** to win a stakes quality allowance heat over 9 furlongs at Woodbine, and it will be interesting to see whether he can get back to that level. Older horses often fire first time after breaks only to flatten out a bit next time out but Dancin in Da'nile was racing with good zest here last month and should be respected.

ECHO LANE's advantage this time is the shorter distance. He is a prominent runner and 11 furlongs seems to be his best trip. He ran right to to his previous best when third behind **BURNHAM SQUARE** and **DANCIN IN D'ANILE** over 12 furlongs here in May, but his close second to Grand Sonata in the 11-furlong Mac Diarmida Stakes at Gulfstream Park suggested that it was his best trip. Perhaps it's better to put it this way; if Echo Lane is to improve again it seems much more likely to happen over 11 furlongs, rather than twelve. Expected to be forwardly placed, he has a very good chance of hitting the board. >>>

CHAPMAN'S PEAK is the one who can prove too good for all bar the favorite though, as he is exiting an easy win on strong allowance company at Keeneland in April. Stepping up to 12 furlongs for the first time, the 4yo son of Quality Road took the race under a virtual hand ride; coming from just off the pace (after a ground saving trip) to win by 1 1/2 lengths from Concord Green, with Carcano third. Chapman's Peak had more up his sleeve as he passed the winning post and there should be a stakes win in this horse some day. Concord Gree was coming off a win at Gulfstream Park but disappointed in the Belmont Gold Cup last week (probably the wrong distance), while Carocana was exiting a runner-up effort at Turfway Park. Chapman's Peak did not outclass these horses but he was much the best and close to his career high **Globeform 105**, most recently earned when he ran third behind Cruise the Nile and **BURNHAM SQUARE** in an 8.5-furlong allowance heat at Gulfstream Park in February (his seasonal bow). He returned the same rating when beaten just a head by Giocoso in the Commonwealth Turf Stakes at Churchill Downs last November. Chapman's Peak looks the logical B-horse in the Chorleywood Stakes.

PARCHMENT PARTY was a main track only entry for the Belmont Gold Cup last week and trainer Bill Mott said at the time that running the horse on turf was not an option - so we can assume he was entered for this contest in case it comes off the turf. He ran to **Globeform 104** winning the Birdstone Stakes over 14 furlongs on the main track at Saratoga last year, when he also romped in the slop in the Belmont Gold Cup, a performance that can't be rated as he was the only horse to handle terrible conditions.

CONCLUSION: Burnham Square will be way too short for a win bet but he'll be a useful single in the horizontal exotics. The way to play the race itself is probably with a straight 1 to beat 7 exacta, a low cost Trifecta plan and a Superfecta plan. The Tri can be a 4-liner with Burnham Square to win and Chapman's Peak taking either second or third, with Dancin in Da'nile / Echo Lane included. For the Super we can go ambitiously in with Chapman's Peak as a 'second key' behind the favorite + Dancin in Da'nile and / or Echo Lane in third / fourth with all others added. Making one extra ticket with the four in the selection box only (i.e. backing ourselves to be spot on) gives us a chance of a bit of a bonus.
