Good to know! What is the difference between rank figures with “p” and “+”?
Notice these differences in the rank columns for some horses.

When “p” is being used it means that the horse produced a new career best and was given a “plus”, denotes that improvement could be expected. When “+” is being used it means that better could be expected, but that the rating the horse ran to on the day was not a new career best (it was either equal to his previous best or below his previous best).

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

GUN PILOT, with 124lbs on his back, has to concede weight all round and he is not well clear on ratings, but he still looks a likely winner. This is not a good renewal of the True North and if he reproduces his form of last time, **Globeform 118** when outclassing Here Mi Song on the Churchill Downs Stakes, he can win again. He went in by 2 1/2 lengths on Kentucky Derby day, when racing just off the pace and proving much the best coming down the lane.

ROTKNEE is also coming off a career best effort, having won the Affirmed Success at Aqueduct last month. He returned Globeform 112 with that front-running effort, moving ip from GF 109, earned when when he won the Hudson Stakes last year.

GUN IT would be the third pick, as he is another to have produced his best last time out, beating the useful yardsticks Nova Rags and Synthesis quite easily in a good allowance race at Aqueduct, where he led every step of the way and won readily by 2 lengths. Given that he has run to GF 100 - 105 - 112 in his last three races, perhaps we should not be surprised if he improves again. He is on an upward curve.

BABY YODA, who ran one huge race here at Saratoga back in 2022 (GF 117), has become unreliable, and he has never been even close to that rating since. Still, he won last time he ran, beating **ACCRETIVE** by a neck over 7 furlongs at Aqueduct. They both have a chanc of hitting the board, in what is rather an uninspiring Grade 2 sprint.

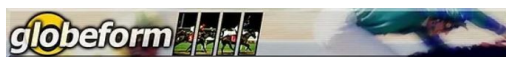

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

CASA CREED is the obvious selection here. The one thing that could change that is if the ground comes up soft, as he is a top of the ground performer. His record here at Saratoga is very good, with 4 wins and 2 third placed efforts from 6 starts at the Spa. He is also well suited by the inner turf track, he has run big straight off the bench four times in the past, so the layoff since a fruitless trip to Dubai is not a worry. In short, this classy sprint / miler ticks all the boxes. He ran to GF 119 - 120 - 119 in the Kelso, Fourstardave and Breeders' Cup Mile last year, taking third behind Maser of the Seas and Mawj in the latter, and his sixth in the Al Quoz at Meydan this spring was not a bad effort, he performed to GF 112 that day.

KUBRICK, a half-brother to top class miler Raging Bull, is an live contender at a good price (morning line 8-1 looks tempting). This Chad Brown trainee produced good form on soft ground in France, so we need to mark him up if there's a lot of rain. Not that he doesn't handle firm. He encountered such conditions when winning at Tampa Bay Downs in early March, before a slow pace worked against him in the Makers Mark Mile in April, where he was last. Facing seven rivals in a stakes quality allowance heat over a mile, he ran out a comfortable 3 3/4-length winner at Tampa. Such an emphatic success did not seem all that likely as the gates opened and Kubrick missed the break quite badly. He found himself at the back of the field, while habitual front-runner Winfromwithinset the pace in company with Dreaming of Kona. That pair certainly had the run of the race, with Kubrick still second last going down the back stretch. He made smooth progress going wide on the home turn though, to take command early in the straight and stroll away for a comfortable win under a hand ride. The winning margin could have been bigger had his rider pressed for more. A G3 winners in France at two, and beaten less than four lengths in the French 2,000 Guineas at three, Kubrick is an interesting newcomer in the mile division. >>>



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Poker Stakes

CARL SPACKLER beat **TALK OF THE NATION** by a head in the Opening Verse Stakes over a mile at Churchill Downs in May, when Talk of the Nation tried to make all and fought back well when Carl Spackler came with a good run from midpack. Talk of the Nation is 6lbs better off at the weights this time, the inner course will favor his running style, and he can reverse the form. Carl Spackler will also handle the track, having won the Saranac Stakes here last season.

LUCKY SCORE has form that gives also him a winning chance in this Poker. Something must have been wrong last time he ran (eased right down in allowance race won by Far Bridge), and the downhill sprint at Santa Anita did not suit him two starts back. Look at his best runs in 2023, though, and you will agree that this is a longshot not to be dismissed. Third in the Woodbine Mile and seventh in the Breeders' Cup Mile, beaten just over two lengths behind the winner, Master of the Seas, who was 4 lengths better than him in the Woodbine Mile; that's solid form. In between these two runs, Lucky Score was beaten just a head in the Nearctic Stakes, one of the best sprints in Canada. A strong closer, he could hit the board here.

MYSTERIOUS NIGHT comes into the reckoning based on his best form in Dubai, especially if we get give in the ground. His round action makes him well suited to soft turf. Drawn by the rail, he may be prominent early, as was his style when he won twice over 7 furlongs at Meydan this winter.

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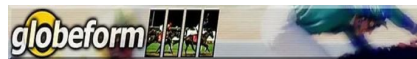

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

CHARGE IT won this event last year and his third to Messier at Met Mile contender Post Time in the one-mile Westchester Stakes last month was good enough to suggest that he has retained his ability aged five. It was his first run since a non-threatening fourth in the Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita last November, and the run should bring him on. He ran to Globeform 115 in the 2023 edition, outclassing Clapton to win by almost five lengths. When Charge It is good he is really good, and we know that he likes Saratoga. He won the Dwyer Stakes here as a 3yo, powering home by 23 lengths in a very good time. At that point, he looked a top class horse. That was not to be but he is well capable of beating what will be put in front of him here. He likes to be near the early speed in his races, and the one most likely to give him an early lead is the Dubai import **BENDOOG**, who is coming off a front running allowance win over 9 furlongs at Aqueduct. He won under a hand ride that day, passing the winning post 4 lengths in front of GOOD SKATE. Bendoog had more up his sleeve and he could be improving. Keeping good company at Meydan last year, he was at his best when second to subsequent Dubai World Cup runner-up Algiers in a G1 contest over 10 furlongs.

CRUPI, like Charge It trained by Todd Pletcher, has also produced his best form in defeat; he ran a good race to finish third behind National Treasure and Senor Buscador in the Pegasus World Cup at Gulfstream Park in January, going down by 4 3/4 lengths in the valuable 9-furlong contest. The two that beat Crupi that day would be long odds-on to beat this bunch, so Crupi must be respected. He has not raced since finishing way down the field in the Dubai World Cup in March. Getting 4lbs from Charge It he looks a danger.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

IDIOMATIC made a perfect start to the season when winning the La Troienne Stakes over 8.5 furlongs at Churchill Downs. The sloppy track gave her an extra edge over her four rivals, and she was long odds-on to deliver, something she did without too much fuss. She beat Free Like Girl by 3 3/4 lengths, with last year's Kentucky Oaks winner **PRETTY MISCHIEVOUS** 1 1/2 lengths further adrift in third place. Idiomatic has won a G1 over this course and distance already, she is in good form, what the weather does is unlikely to bother her connections, and she is the obvious selection in this event. She outstayed Randomized by half a length in the Breeders' Cup Distaff at Santa Anita last November, and that filly could be her main threat again. Idiomatic proved just the stronger and that she took more experience to the table stood her in good stead. She had enjoyed some comfortable wins but she had also been in a couple of close battles, something Randomized had not. Idiomatic kept on improving last year, when a gate to wire win in the 9-furlong Personal Ensign Stakes over a sloppy track here at Saratoga was a big leap up for the daughter of Curlin. She had shown smart form in her previous starts, and she was coming off an odds-on win the Delaware Handicap (beating the G3 winner Classy Edition by a head when conceding 2lbs) but capturing one of the top races at Saratoga from champions Secret Oath and Nest was something else. Idiomatic went from being a Grade 2 performer to being one of the best distaff runners in the land that day, and her Breeders' Cup success clinched an Eclipse Award as best older female.

RANDOMIZED was beaten by **SOUL OF AN ANGEL** when making her seasonal debut in the Ruffian Stakes at Aqueduct in May but she clearly needed the race and must have a good chance of turning the tables on that rival here. Aged four, she may be the one open to most improvement, having raced just eight times for four wins (she ran only once at two). This daughter of Kentucky Derby winner Nyquist really turned a corner after running as if something was amiss in the Acorn Stakes at Belmont last June (badly beaten sixth behind Pretty Mischievous). Randomized was sent to Saratoga, where she won the one-mile Wilton Stakes by 1 1/2 lengths from Just Katherine, who took a good allowance race at the same venue next time out. Randomized used the Wilton as a prep for the 10-furlong Alabama Stakes and that event became her breakthrough run. Making all, she drew right off in the home straight to win by 4 lengths from dual G3 winner Wet Paint. >>>



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Ogden Phipps Stakes

Randomized went off at 7-1 in the Alabama. Next time she ran, against older rivals in the 9-furlong Beldame Stakes at Aqueduct, she went off at 1/3, and she certainly ran like a horse with such cramped odds, cruising home by 3 3/4 lengths from Beholder Mile winner A Mo Reay. Next up for Randomized was the Breeders' Cup Distaff at Santa Anita, and she ran really well there. Idiomatic proved too good but she had to work harder than expected, to beat Randomized by half a length. It will be interesting to see how they fare against each other this season. Randomized is 2-for-3 at Saratoga and her Alabama win, when she performed to Globeform 119p, confirmed that this is a track that suits her well.

RAGING SEA improved markedly on her 2023-form when winning the Doubledogdare Stakes at Saratoga on her seasonal debut, and this lightly raced 4yo can improve again - and prove good enough to hit the board in the Ogden Phipps. She won by 3 1/4 lengths from Hidden Connection and Scylla, who finished third, franked the form by winning the Shawnee Stakes easily on her next start.

SOUL OF AN ANGEL is also coming off a career best, while **PRETTY MISCHIEF** needs to bounce back after a disappointing third in the La Troienne, 5 1/4 lengths behind Idiomatic. With 124lbs, the same as Idiomatic and Randomized, she is up against it on ratings.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

BOOK'EM DANNY is completely the wrong price on the morning line here. By far the best horse in the field, he has been put up at 9-2 and one bookmaker in Europe offer 6-1. Tremendous value. Yes, he has the inside post and that is not a dream position but he should still be a clear favorite for this 7-furlong contest. Most likely, that is his optimum distance.

He is set for his first run back since the Saudi Derby (G2) back in late February, when he was just a stride short of winning. Running a rock solid race in the one-turn mile event, he made the Japanese champion Forever Young pull out all the stops and then some to win by a head. It was a tremendous effort by Book'em Danno and not altogether surprising, as he had looked high class also on his seasonal debut, a 12 1/2-length romp in the Pasco Stakes at Tampa Bay Downs in January. That event was run over 7 furlongs, the same distance as the Woody Stephens, and Book'em Danno - although staying a mile - is much better suited by this trip. He is probably going to develop into a high class sprinter. With Bentornato 6 lengths behind in third place, he performed to GF 111+ in the Saudi Derby. Bentornato is not a top class performer but he did win two legs of the Florida Stallion series at Gulfstream Park last year and is clearly useful. Saying the same about Forever Young would be an understatement; he went on to win the UAE Derby (G2) in Dubai and was beaten just two noses when third behind Mystik Dan and Sierra Leone in the Kentucky Derby (G1). Both the UAE Derby and the Kentucky Derby were sub-standard classics this year, but Forever Young's two runs since the Saudi Derby are still great boosts to Book'em Danno's form - and his performance at Tampa Bay Downs also stands up to inspection. In fact, that was even better. >>>



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Woody Stephens Stakes

He absolutely outclassed West Saratoga in the Pasco. Seven furlongs is too short for West Saratoga but he won the Iroquois Stakes (G3) over a mile last year and this season he has run good races for third in the Sam F Davis (G3) and second in the Jeff Ruby (G3). West Saratoga produced Globeform 96 in the Iroquois (his best rating to date) and with him running ten pounds below that level in the Pasco, Book'em Danno ends up on **Globeform 119p**. That seems incredibly high for a 3yo in January but there is another result that suggests it's not too high, namely that of the Gasparilla Stakes for 3yo fillies, run over the same distance an hour before the Pasco. Mystic Lake won the Gasparilla, covering the distance in 1.24.69 - fully 1.43 seconds slower than Book'em Danno. 1.4 sec. equals about 7 lengths, which equals 17.5lbs on the Globeform scale. So, how good is Mystic Lake? Not bad at all. She ran third in the Mazarine Stakes (G3) at Woodbine last year and she won the Miss Preakness Stakes (G3) at Pimlico in May. She has clearly improved a lot since the Gasparilla win but this does suggest that Book'em Danno's Pasco win was a performance out of the top drawer. While Mystic Lake was all out to win here race, Book'em Danno won with a length or two up his sleeve, and he was even carrying 6lbs more than the filly. No wonder he ran such a good race in Saudi. His juvenile form was also strong; with three straight wins - the third one a visually impressive win in the 6-furlong Futurity Stakes (LR) - and a second in the 8-furlong Nashua Stakes (LR), where he was outstayed to the tune of 3/4 length by Where's Chris (whom he had beaten almost seven lengths into third in the Futurity).

VLAHOS ran a tremendous race in the Pat Day Mile at Churchill Downs, hanging on for third, 1 1/2 lengths behind Seize the Grey, after setting fast fractions. With Seize the Grey winning the Peakness, this piece of form gets a lot of attention and Vlahos - a horse we backed at big odds last time - is now 6-1 on the morning line. He was a head behind **NASH** in the Pat Day but this drop in distance, and that he now gets 4lbs for that rivals, makes him the one to prefer of the two this time. Nash has also been entered at Churchill Downs next week, so could be a scratch here.

VALENTINE CANDY impressed when easily beating subsequent Chick Lang Stakes winner **FROST FREE** by 1 1/2 lengths while conceding 3lbs in the 6-furlong Bachelor Stakes at Oaklawn Park in April. Frost Free now has to give him 2lbs so Valentine Candy is likely to beat that rival again. This Asmussen trainee fits in well here, having performed to Globeform 114 in the Bachelor, but there is one question mark; regarding this step up in distance. He has never been further than 6 furlongs and that trip suits him really well. That said, he was strong at the finish last time and perhaps seven will be ok.

BARKSDALE is the interesting longshot in the field and this son of Street Sense could be capable of an upset, if Book'em Danno does not run to form. Barksdale was gelded before this season and he has improved markedly on his 2yo form, to win two good allowance races, one at Keeneland and one at Aqueduct, where he ran 6.5 furlongs in 1.15 flat to win with ease. The track was riding fast that day but still, note that the track record is 1.14.35, set by the top class Coronado's Quest way back in 1997. Stolen Magic, who was second to Barksdale at Aqueduct, runs in race 6 on Friday. Barksdale's 3 1/2-length win at Keeneland was his best and it has worked out well. The runner-up, Great Richi went on to win by 2 1/2 lengths in allowance company at Churchill Downs, beating Sir Greyvind - a colt won won by 5 1/4 lengths in similar company next time out. Barksdale travels well in his races, finished the job off well, and gallops out strongly. There is more to come from this 20-1 shot and he must be included in race exotics.

PRINCE OF MONACO, a fast and precocious juvenile for Bob Baffert last year, and his barnmate **IMAGINATION** both seem likely to offer poor value in the betting. Prince of Monaco is the one to prefer but he went the wrong way after winning the Best Pal last summer and has not raced since the Breeders' Cup.

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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS - JAIPUR STAKES

This is an open looking, tricky race to predict but there is one factor here that favors at least a handful over lots of others that are in on a chance based on ratings, namely the lack of pace. At least on paper. It can be dangerous that there will be no pace because a race does not have many confirmed front-runners. We saw what happened in the Belmont Gold Cup, for instance, and on that occasion the strong pace made all the difference for the winner. Interestingly, it happens quite often on big days, like this one, the Kentucky Derby day and Breeders' Cup days, that some jockeys go way too hard too early. Still, those we can expect to flash strong early pace here are Dancing Buck (post 3), Coppola (4) and the favorite Cogburn (8). If it pans out that way then Cogburn has a good chance of following up on his win at Churchill Downs last month, but the margins are small in this division and an upset win is not at all unlikely.

FILO DI ARIANNA comes out best on ratings, based on his performance in the Poker Stakes over a mile last year, when he ran to Globeform 114 to split the classy milers Emmanuel and Chez Pierre in a close finish. Can he be as good over 5.5 furlongs? Possibly, and it is interesting that Mark Casse runs him here, rather than in the Poker. It was easy to be taken by Filo di Arianna's third behind Cogburn at Churchill Downs, where he ran close to the pace and stayed on gamely (after having lost a length or so turning for home) to be beaten 2 1/4 lengths by **COGBURN** - who travelled strongly throughout and enjoyed a perfect trip. While Cogburn was a strong winner and improved to Globeform 119 in the process, Filo di Arianna ran to GF 111+. As mentioned, this race may not get the strongest sprint pace ever seen, and that would favor Cogburn, but there is another thing to note; the weights. Filo di Arianna is now 8lbs better off at the weights. That equals just over 2 1/2 lengths over 5.5 furlongs so, yes, this 15-1 shot does have a chance. He is as big as 22-1 with bookmakers and that's not a bad each-way bet, especially if you can get four places terms.

DANCING BUCK produced one excellent performance back in 2022, running to Globeform 120 to win the Belmont Turf Sprint over 6 furlongs on soft ground. He has not been able to reproduce that level of form but his last three runs, all returning GF 114, tells us that he has found some consistency, and he is a live contender in this sprint. He made all for fine win over **AMERICAN MONARCH** and **ALOGON** in the Elusive Quality (also 6 fur) last month. Dancing Buck has two things in his favor; an inside post and the likely pace scenario. Look for him to be part of the pace. What is not ideal, however, is the trip, as he is at his best over 6 furlongs. **COPPOLA** is also a speedy runner with a good post (4) and his best form puts him right in the mix, but his two most recent outings have not been good - it seems that his good winter form has tailed off. **ARZAK** bypassed Churchill Downs and thus comes here a fresh horse, having been rested since winning the Shakertown Stakes over this distance at Keeneland two months ago. He was never far off the pace, and ran out a game one-length winner from **MISCHIEF MAGIC**, who was third behind Cogburn and Filo Di Arianna at Churchill Downs. Mischief Magic, who is a strong closer, has since been gelded and sometimes that change makes quite a difference to a horse. **STAR OF MYSTERY** ran second to the high class Hong Kong sprinter California Spangle in the Al Quoz Sprint on Dubai World Cup day at Meydan and this 3yo filly could improve again. She did not get a good start at Meydan and stayed on well at the finish (she is normally held up). That was on a straight course though, and she will be facing a new challenge here; going around a bend is not something European sprinters are used to. That said, they have been getting good results over here the past few years, so Star of Mystery is interesting. She has 4 wins and 4 second place finishes from 9 starts to date. **GROOMS ALL BIZNESS** is unfortunately on the 'AE list' and needs one scratch to get into the field. If he draws in, do not overlook him. He ran to Globeform 116 once last year and returned GF 113+ when winning the Turf Sprint at Pimlico last month (coming from off the pace on heavy ground). He broke from post 1 at Pimlico, and will be wide here if he gets in. The early leaders went way too fast in his race, making it a perfect setup for Grooms All Bizness, but it was first and foremost a great ride by Ruiz, who waited patiently, not a fluke result making Grooms All Bizness look better than he is. He was just off the pace and racing on firm ground when he recorded his best rating by winning the Get Serious Stakes at Monmouth Park a year ago.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

WHITE ABBARIO is getting started on what will hopefully be a campaign leading to Del Mar and the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) in November. He won the BC Classic last year but his best performance was actually here at Saratoga, when he crushed his rivals in the 9-furlong Whitney Stakes (G1), taking it by 6 1/2 lengths from Zandon, who went on to win the Woodward Stakes by over four lengths on his next start. White Abarrio followed up with a solid win ate the Breeders' Cup, beating Derma Sotogake by a length at Santa Anita. After this, he was prepared for the Saudi Cup in February, but that became a wasted journey. The son of Race Day ran inexplicably badly in the \$20 million race, folding tamely at the top of the stretch and finishing tenth of 14 runners. Reportedly, nothing came to light explaining this poor run. He will be a strong favorite for the Met Mile but does it make sense to take very short odds about White Abarrio this time? He has been off for a long time and may not be at his absolute best this week. Whether a mile is a bit short for him is hard to say. Yes, he ran third in this event 12 months ago, but he had previously impressed over 7 furlongs at Gulfstream Park. That win was his last run for Saffie Joseph Jr. Richard Dutrow ran him just three times after taking over the training last spring; in the Met Mile, the Whitney and the BC Classic. He seems to have the same plan this year. White Abarrio is 6-5 on the morning line and he can win this without reproducing Globeform 128 (his Whitney win) but if **NATIONAL TREASURE** performs to his previous best, Globeform 122, then White Abarrio, who is set to give him one pound, needs GF 123 and a bit to beat him. National Treasure's best form came when he was just touched off by the mighty Cody's Wish in the Breeders' Cup Mile, so we know that he is running over the right trip here. One difference is that the BC Mile was a two-turn race, while this Met Mile will be sent off from the Wilton chute, meaning we are looking at a half turn to begin with - yet another factor making this a fascinating contest. National Treasure won the 9-furlong Pegasus World Cup in January, using his strong-running, prominent style to full effect. He held on from a fast closing Senor Buscador, who gained revenge when winning the Saudi Cup with National Treasure fourth. >>



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Metropolitan Mile

HOIST THE GOLD is a runner who might do White Abarrio a favour. An all the way winner of the Cigar Mile at Aqueduct last year (when he ran to Globeform 118 over a sloppy track), Hoist the Gold is normally sent hard from the start, and an early speed duel between him and National Treasure would suit White Abarrio well. However, Hoist the Gold's run when fifth in the Churchill Downs Stakes last month was nowhere near what he has been capable of, so perhaps he is not in very good form at present.

POST TIME is in good form. He ran his best race to date when failing by just 3/4 length in his attempt at giving Messier 6lbs in the Westchester Stakes over a mile at Aqueduct a month ago. He had previously won two good 7-furlong events, the General George and the Carter, and he is a game and consistent horse who has hit the board in all of his ten races.

BLAZING SEVENS was narrowly beaten by National Treasure in last year's Preakness Stakes, but failed as the odds-on favorite when taking a drop in class next time out (ran as if something was amiss to be third in the Curlin Stakes). He had been off for nine months when returning with a game win in allowance company at Aqueduct in April, when he did not need anything like his best form to come out on top.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

This important turf contest has an intriguing runner in the mix, Mark Casse's Knicks Go Stakes winner Strong Quality, who switches back to turf a month after having produced his career best form when running on dirt. At first glance it's easy to think that he doesn't have much of a chance in the Manhattan but, given his lenient weight - and his running style - he actually has a chance. His best turf performance came on soft ground so, yes, Strong Quality is a live longshot we simply have to consider.

NATIONS PRIDE was below par on his seasonal debut in the Man O'War Stakes at Aqueduct last month (third to Silver Knott) but it was not a bad run and the outing ought to have brought him forward. His two best runs last year were high class; an easy 3-length win in a G1 over 10 furlongs on soft ground in Munich followed by a similar performance in the Canadian International at Woodbine, also over 10 furlongs on soft. He won geared down in Munich, outclassing the German Derby winner Fantastic Moon, who won a strong G2 event on his next start. His runner-up at Woodbine, Royal Champion, had won two strong Listed races in England earlier in the season. Nations Pride made all in Germany but was held up in midfield in Canada, and he is a versatile performer. Having been a close third in the 9-furlong Dubai Turf last spring, he should not be inconvenienced by this distance.

STRONG QUALITY has never been better than last time out, when he led every step of the way to beat Kupuna and Five Star General gamely in the Knicks Go, run over a mile on dirt at Churchill Downs. Setting a fast pace, Strong Quality kept on running hard all the way to the line and his time, 1.35.4, was two lengths faster than subsequent Preakness winner Seize the Grey's time in the Pat Day Mile on the same day. Three weeks later, Five Star General and Kupuna advertised the form by running one-two in a good allowance race. Strong Quality produced Globeform 114 in the Knicks Go, having run to GF 111 when beaten just a neck by the in-form Beatbox (who carried 4lbs less than him) in the Fair Grounds Stakes, run over 9 furlongs on soft ground. His next run was not so good, as he was fifth to **I'M VERY BUSY** in the Muniz Memorial but perhaps that was simply an off day. That the Manhattan is 9.5 furlongs this year is good news for Strong Quality's camp, and any rain would also be welcome. He is a most efficient front-runner and there's a chance that, not being a high profile contender, he will be ignored by rivals and get an easy time on the lead.

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AL RIFFA has been in good company in Europe, his form is good enough to give him a winning chance here and, with just two starts last year (he was a G1 winner ast two) and one so far this season, he could improve. He was beaten just a length when fourth to Haya Zark in the Prix Ganay at Longchamp in late April, and Haya Zark confirmed the level of form by running placed in another G1 event next time out. The Ganay is over 10.5 furlongs and it was run on soft ground. Al Riffa was staying on from the back of the field, running the same sort of race that gave him second to the French champion Ace Impact in the Prix Guillaume d'Ornano over 10 furlongs at Deauville last summer (on good to soft). Al Riffa will need to be closer to the early pace here though, as he cuts back in distance.

I'M VERY BUSY became worked up in the paddock when favorite for the Turf Classic at Churchill Downs and was edgy and restless also in the stalls, so we can probably overlook his dull performance on that occasion. His win one start prior was impressive, and - provided that he does not misbehave again - he must have a chance here. He blew past his rivals in the home stretch in the Muniz Memorial over 9 furlongs at Fair Grounds in March, finishing the race off in a manner sugesting he would every bit as good over further. I'm Very Busy is improving. He beat Gigante by 3 3/4 lengths in the Muniz, running almost like a green juvenile once he hit the front and looking value for at least another half-length. The useful yardstick **WEBSLINGER** was third and the first two home in the Fair Grounds Stakes, Beatbox and **STRONG QUALITY**, filled fourth and fifth. Solid form, and there was something about the way he hit the line that day, very strongly, that makes me suspect he will become one of the best turf runners around this season.

PROGRAM TRADING came to the rescue for Chad Brown's team in the Turf Classic, winning the race as I'm Very Busy had a bad day. Maming his first start since winning the Hollywood Derby last December, Program Trading raced prominently throughout at Churchill Downs, and battled on to beat Naval Power by a head. Improving to Globeform 116p in the process, this son of Lope de Vega is on the same rating as I'm Very Busy now, and his running style makes him a good fit here. He beat Webslinger in the Hollywood Derby and that rival filled third in the Turf Classic, giving the result a formful look. Program Trading seems to act on any going, having handled soft ground well when taking the Saratoga Derby last year (also there beating Webslinger).

MEASURED TIME is a late developing, talented son of Frankel. He finished fourth as the favorite in the Dubai Turf at Meydan in March, beaten 1 1/2 lengths behind Factuer Cheval. Prior to the Dubai Turf, he had won the Jebel Hatta, a somewhat soft G1 event at Meydan, beating Ottoman Fleet by 1 3/4 lengths. Ottoman Fleet is not top class but he has won two G3 races this season and he is no slouch either, so let's not dismiss Measured Time, who will be ridden by William Buick. Dettori rides Nations Pride, so the barnmate is also in good hands.

OHANA HONOR also comes into the reckoning based on ratings, having produced Globeform 110 and 108 on his two most recent outings, but his best did come over 12 furlongs and perhaps this distance will be bit too short for him. Drawn in stall two he can be expected to go forward early.

This is a such a wide open affair. You can make a case for six of the nine runners - so, when for a change, a contender likely to go off at a huge price makes appeal, why should we not take a chance with that runner; **Strong Quality**. If he manages to run to Globeform 114 again (and there is no reason to say he can't), well, then only an improver amongst the others or a back to form Nations Pride can beat him on figures. The most likely improver in the field is **I'm Very Busy** - who deserves another chance after he got fractious last time. These two share the A-ranking.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

This year's three-year-olds are not a vintage bunch. With Mystik Dan, Sierra Leone and Seize the Grey all having run to no more than Globeform 117 we are still looking for a star in the male division. Fierceness, who was so good in the Florida Derby, has by far the best performance and perhaps he will bounce back, after his poor run in the Kentucky Derby, and dominate in the summer / fall events. He is not in this field, but Todd Pletcher has another unique talent on his team, Mindframe, and there's a good chance that he will be the one this Saturday. Like Fierceness last year, he produced an exceptional debut when first seen in action.

MINDFRAME made his debut in a 7-furlong maiden at Gulfstream Par in March, and won the race most impressively by 13 3/4 lengths from One Sharp Cookie, who won a similar contest next time out. Mindframe came from off a strong pace and simply blew away from his rivals when taking the lead coming into the home straight. He stopped the clocks in a sharp 1.21.6 and could have run even faster. The Sir Shackleton Stakes, a Listed event for four year-olds and up, was run on the same distance two hours later, and won by Oscar Eclipse, whose winning time was 1.23.23. Given that Mindframe won under a hand ride (and Oscar Eclipse was all out to win by a neck), it is safe to say that Mindframe was 2 seconds faster. That equals 10 lengths. Oscar Eclipse earned Globeform 102p. They both carried 118lbs. Even without factoring in an 8lbs weight for age factor, this means that - purely on time - Mindframe produced a high class figure - already on his debut. His next start came at Churchill Downs on Derby day at Churchill Downs, when Mindframe stretched out to 8.5 furlongs in allowance company. It became another stroll but it was quite a different pace scenario. The maiden he won at Gulfstream had a very strong pace. This time, Irad Ortiz sent Mindframe to the lead >>>

and managed to slow things right down. Mindframe enjoyed an easy time on the lead, and won by 7 1/2 lengths from Brad Cox's Cornishman, whose two preceding runs were a second to subsequent Peter Pan Stakes winner **ANTIQUARIAN** in February and a win at Fair Grounds in March, when he beat Steve Asmussen's next-out winner Gun Party. Mindframe impressed again but the way the race was run told us little about his stamina capabilities. The way he has finished his races off suggests that he will get further, but this is a step up to 10 furlongs, against much better horses than those he has faced thus far and it won't be easy. He could just be a much better horse than the principals coming out of the Derby and the Preakness though, and it makes sense to take chance on this son of Florida Derby winner Constitution.

Mindframe, bought for \$600,000 as a yearling, was a late foal, born on May 13, so it's not a surprise that he has been a late developing sort. He is a half-brother to Hollywood Walk, who won four turf races from 5.5 to 8.5 furlongs. His dam, Walk of Stars (Street Sense) won the 7-furlong Pink Ribbon Stakes and she is a half-sister to Strike the Moon, winner of the 7-furlong Charles Town Oaks and runner-up in the 8.5-furlong Delaware Oaks. Is Mindframe a miler? Looking at his pedigree it's easy to assume that he might be. Next question; is he a freak? Watching his races it is easy to assume that he might be.

SIERRA LEONE looked the best horse in the Kentucky Derby. He came with a good run from off the pace and was unlucky not to get up for a win. Beaten just a nose by Mystik Dan, who enjoyed a dream trip, Sierra Leone was in front a stride or two after they flashed past the winning post. Sierra Leone must have a good chance of making amends here, though he is not a straightforward horse and perhaps not one to take a short price about. He bypassed the Preakness, something that ought to give him an advantage against Mystik Dan and Seize the Grey, and - with Seize the Grey, The Wine Steward and Dornoch all capable of running fast straight from the start - Sierra Leone is likely to get a strong pace to close into. He needs that to be seen to full effect. Coming from way back, he won the Blue Grass Stakes at Keeneland, and when second in the Remsen Stakes last year. He went by the pace-setter Dornoch a furlong out, but Dornoch fought back to win by a nose. The pair was almost five lengths clear of the third placed Drum Roll Please and the form of the race worked out well subsequently. Sierra Leone, a \$2.3 million yearling, is a good horse but he is also a bit one paced. A 12-furlong Belmont would have suited him really well.

SEIZE THE GREY led every step of the way in the Preakness Stakes, and ran on well all the way to the line, beating Mystik Dan and Catching Freedom by 2 1/4 lengths. Coming off a gutsy win in the Pat Day Stakes on Kentucky Derby day, Seize the Grey improved again at Pimlico, and he could well be on an upward curve still. Drawn in stall one, he is set to get a ground saving trip around Saratoga, but this is not an easy place to win races going gate to wire, and the step up in distance is also a concern. **DORNOCH**, who blew his chances with a poor start in the Kentucky Derby, will probably be sent from the gates, and **ANTIQUARIAN**, who was in the first three throughout when winning the Peter Pan, may also be prominent. **THE WINE STEWARD** is not as sure to go forward but that's how he was ridden in the Peter Pan. Any rain would be good news for Seize the Grey, and also for Mystik Dan. They have both performed well over wet tracks.

MYSTIK DAN was not able to follow up in the Preakness Stakes, looking a bit flat two weeks after his big effort in the Kentucky Derby, and the worry with this colt must be whether he is simply regressing now. He ran a fine race at Churchill Downs, where he was also given a fine ride, and if he returns to the form that sent him to the winners' circle there, well, then Mystik Dan could win the Belmont. Things did really go his way in the Derby though, and he had no excuse in the Preakness - where he enjoyed almost a carbon copy trip but failed to fire coming down the home stretch. He was beaten 2 1/4 lengths by Seize the Grey and just held second by a head when Catching Freedom came with a late rally. Mystik Dan will stay this distance, that much we know, but will he be able to produce his best? This will be his sixth run of the season.

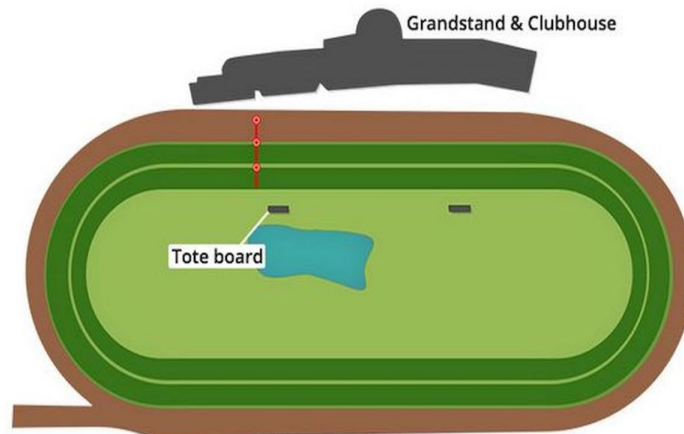
