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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

CLOCK TOWER tried to make all when he ran a game race to finish third in the Bourbon Stakes over 8.5 furlongs at Keeneland, not beaten far behind Minaret Station and Golden Afternoon, who won a good allowance race last weekend, and he has been found a nice spot here. Getting John Velazquez on board (who rode him in his first two races), he should be able to dictate matters, and a mile around Del Mar will suit him well. He has to be the selection. With two defections, that 3-1 morning line is even less likely to happen than it seemed this morning.

SCIPIO looks to be the main danger. He has had difficult trips in his two most recent starts, finishing well over this mile trip on both occasions, and he is an unusually good maiden. He was third to Artistas in the Del Mar Juvenile Turf, and he finished fourth to Chasing Liberty in the TAA Stakes at the Breeders' Cup meet. Shuffled back early, he had to find room on the inside late in the game that day and one could argue that he finished faster than the three who beat him. That said, note that **SNOWDONIA**, who was fifth in that race, had an even worse trip around, having to negotiate his way from post 14. He was also full of running through the last half-furlong. It's not impossible that he can match strides with Scipio this time - but they both need pace to run at, something they may not get.

CONCLUSION: A seven-runner field where three stick out, and not a race where we can expect to get all of the X-mas presents paid for; but it's a race well worth getting involved in. Using Clock Tower on top, with Scipio second and Snowdonia third or fourth, while mixing all others in, could be a smart Superfecta play. don't forget to do the same plan to smaller stakes with Snowdonia second - and note that Charlie's to Blame, who he beat by half a length two starts back, will be running in race 12 today.

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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

Noble Reflection heads the ranking if we take his good third placed finish in the 2023 Eddie D Stakes, when he performed to Globeform 112, into account - but he has been so dull in his three starts this year and it's hard to see him in with a chance. He ran a bit better last time out than in his first two races in '24 so perhaps he is about to round back into form, but even if he is this is 5 furlongs, a bit too short for his liking.

UNCONQUERABLE KEEN won this event 12 months ago, beating **TURN ON THE JETS** impressively by almost two lengths, and he has a good chance of going back-to-back. Getting a prep in a four-runner (but high quality) allowance race over 6 furlongs at Santa Anita, he finished third, beaten half a length and a nose by Irideo and Turn On The Sets, who is in opposition once again here. The two both ran to Globeform 110, Unconquerable Keen produced **Globeform 112** when taking the '23 Stormy Liberal, this cut back to 5 furlongs favors him, and he is a narrow selection.

SORRENTO SKY is coming off two really game wins, having beaten Red Pill by half a length over this course and distance in September, and proving 3/4 length too good for Muftadaa over 6.5 furlongs at Santa Anita. He drew the rail here but that was also the case last time out, when he finished his race off strongly after sitting just off the early pace. He's in with a chance of a hat trick.

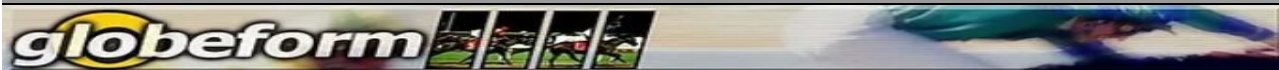
JUST NAILS, with a fine record both over this distance and over this course, is also in good form. She came up just short when finishing strongly to take second in the 5-furlong Senator Ken Maddy Stakes a month ago. Twirling Queen beat her by a neck, in a race that was run a second slower than the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, staged on the following day. There's plenty of speed in the mix, something that will be to her liking.

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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

AG BULLET steps back up in distance, having run such a good race to finish third, beaten just a neck by Starlust, in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint over this course a month ago. She performed to GF 115 on that occasion and her versatility is really impressive. Well drawn i post three, she is in a good position to go straight to the lead here and, with the speedy **KEHOE BEACH** in the mix if she turns up, this could become most interesting. If they go too fast it will set things up well for the favorite **GINA ROMANTICA**, if they manage to set a sensible pace it might just be Ag Bullet's day. If Kehoe Beach does not run, well then Ag Bullet's chances of success increase.

Her performance at the Breeders' Cup as no big surprise, she was our B-horse in the race. She has improved dramatically this season, winning the one-mile Osunitas Stakes at Del Mar and the Ladies Turf Sprint over 6.5 furlongs at Kentucky Downs, where she bossed the field throughout and won hard held, beating Dontlookbackatall by a 'long looking' 5 1/2 lengths. Ocean Club finished third, as Ag Bullet broke the track record. Dontlookbackatall had won the Caress Stakes at Saratoga on her preceding start and Ocean Club won the Noble Damsel at Aqueduct on her next start. Ag Bullet produced a high class performance at Kentucky Downs, earning **Globeform 118p**, three pounds higher than her previous best, which came in the Osunitas five weeks earlier. She took that race by 3 1/2 lengths, like the Ladies Turf Sprint also under a hand ride. Her runner-up, BC Filly & Mare Turf contender Hang the Moon, won the Mabee Stakes at Del Mar next time out. Ag Bullet's form worked out so well - but she disappointed in the First Lady Stakes at Keeneland on October 5. Taking significant money close to the off, she was the 5-2 favorite there (against a Chad Brown trio), so there's no doubt she was well fancied. She set the pace, but there was little left in the tank coming down the lane. Ag Bullet tired to finish fourth, 4 1/4 lengths behind **GINA ROMANTICA**. Given that she had won over the distance at Del Mar, and over the testing 6.5-furlong trip at Kentucky Downs, it was hard to think that it was the mile that beat Ag Bullet at Keeneland. Perhaps she wasn't quite right on the day. With good Del Mar form and a better draw than the favorite, she gets a chance of revenge against Gina Romantica today.

GINA ROMANTICA won't be easy to beat, however. She bounced right back to her best in the First Lady, coming from off the pace to gain a solid 2-length win over Chili Flag, another G1 winner trained by Chad Brown. Running to **Globeform 115**, the mark she had produced in the 2023 Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita (fourth to Master of the Seas) and this year's Diana Stakes at Saratoga, she proved that she had held her form aged five. This will be her last run before retirement and going against such horses (especially fillies and mares) late in the season often pays off, but there's no reason to think that Gina Romantica is below par right now. She misses the Breeders' Cup due to a quarter crack, missed 'about one week's training, according to her trainer, and was rerouted to the Matriarch. We can expect another good run from this daughter of Into Mischief. One thing that could give Ag Bullet the edge is the short straight at Del Mar, a track Gina Romantica has never raced over before. Her best performances have come at Keeneland, Santa Anita and Saratoga, where she ran a close third when trying to give 2lbs to Whitebeam in the Diana in July. She was then was badly compromised by the lack of pace when runner-up to Beaute Cachee in the Ballston Spa - also at Saratoga.

NADETTE is coming off a good run when beaten just a head by **MOUFFY** in the Dance Smartly over 8.5 furlongs at Woodbine less than a month ago. She finished strongly from far back, and just missed getting the win. Mouffy, who was in receipt on one pound, also closed in from off the pace. These two would both relish a strong pace here but it would have to be a real meltdown for either to beat the two principals, if they run to about their best form. >>>

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KEHOE BEACH is a bit of a surprise name on the card, just three days after helping us to a nice 51-1 exacta when making all to beat Pounce readily by 1 1/4 lengths in the Mrs Revere Stakes over 8.5 furlongs at Churchill Downs on Friday. It seems a bit strange if she does run, as it would mean long ship off virtually no rest. Wesley Ward said after the race that she would be put away for the winter and be aimed at the Jenny Wiley Stakes at Keeneland in the spring so perhaps she is a scratch today. She improved again at Churchill Downs but another step up will be needed here. This 3yo daughter of Ohama Beach has been absolutely hammered in each of her three most recent starts, and delivered every time. Del Mar would suit her

CONCLUSION: Wait for scratches before deciding whether a bet on Ag Bullet should be big or not so big.

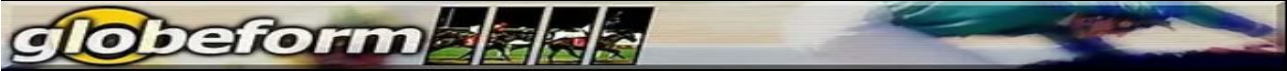

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

SCOTLAND has the best form in the book, having performed to Globeform 116 when winning a 7-furlong allowance race at Saratoga in July. He impressed that day, bating Accretive by 3 lengths, with Castle Chaos 2 lengths further adrift in third place. A break followed, leading to to the Vosburgh Stakes over the same distance (but on a sloppy track) at Aqueduct in late September. Scotland produced another fine performance, but had to settle for second, 4 1/4 lengths behind the smart sprint / miler Mufasa. Mufasa failed at the Breeders' Cup subsequently but we should not read much into that; he was so cold on the board at Del Mar - something must have been amiss. Scotland also disappointed on his subsequent start, running seventh in the 6-furlong Bold Ruler at Aqueduct. Perhaps that trip was too short for him; he broke through winning the 9-furlong Curlin Stakes last year and this one-turn mile will suit him well.

THREE TECHNIQUE is the one who looks too big on the morning line. **12-1** about this contender really is tempting. Yes, he is inconsistent and he is coming off a dull run in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (where he was 43-1) but look back on the result of the Ack Ack Stakes over this course and distance in September; Three Technique won, beating Tumbarumba by 1 1/2 lengths. Tumbarumba also ran in the BC Dirt Mile, finishing fourth. So Three Technique has recent form that makes him interesting here. The Ack Ack was run over a sloppy track, and he handles wet conditions better than most, but he is just as good on fast tracks and he has a solid record here at Churchill Downs (8-for-12 in the top three). >>>

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INJUNCTION has been showing really consistent form of late, running to GF 113 - 111 - 112 in his three most recent races. A prominent, game runner, he also likes Churchill Downs and he is in with a good chance. After beating Mr Wireless in the Schaefer Memorial at Horseshoe Indiana, he ran second to the high class Saudi Crown in the Cowboy Jones at Ellis, then third, 1 1/2 lengths behind Coastal Mission in the Parx Dirt Mile. Coastal Mission franked the form by winning the Forty Niner Stakes at Aqueduct next time out.

BRUNACINI, a lightly race 3yo coming off a fine win when setting a new stakes record in the 7-furlong Perryville Stakes at Keeneland, is the potential improver. Unlike the older horses, he can easily move up by lengths again - and he is taken to beat them here. Post one is not ideal but he started from this gate when running a close fifth to the good looking next-out winner Kinetic over 8.5 furlongs here at Churchill Downs in September, and he improved to Globeform 108p in the Perryville, a race he win by a neck from Book'em Danno - one of the best young sprinters around - and Knightsbridge (they ran a dead-heat for second). Brunacini came from off the pace and he won't have any problems getting a today's distance. Give him a clean trip and he might prove up to winning the Cherokee Mile.

CONCLUSION: Anyone of the top four on the ranking can win this race but Brunacini has upside and is therefore preferred. One way to play the race is to key him in first, second, third with the other three in a Trifecta plan. That's just 18 lines (3 x 6) and a cheap way of getting involved; grading the stakes playing 50% with him on top, 30% in second and 20% in third makes sense. If Three Technique is as big as 12-1 we also need a have at least something on him.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

GOOD CHEER has won all of her three races and she looked a high class filly in the making when overcoming a difficult start to win the Rags to Riches over a mile at this venue just over a month ago. Coming from off the pace in the five-runner field, she was different class to her rivals, winning quite comfortably by 4 3/4 lengths from Claire's Charm, who was coming off a half-length maiden win over Girl Math (as the two drew 11 lengths clear of the rest). Good Cheer had previously won her maiden by over eight lengths and an allowance race by 17 lengths (beating Adeera, who was fourth, beaten 10 lengths in the Rags to Riches). This daughter of Medaglia d'Oro is expected to improve again and she will probably be tough to beat.

QUIETSID is the one who is proven in graded stakes company, however, and it could become a costly mistake to assume that this talented Malibu Moon filly is here in hope of getting second. She has solid form in the book; second to Immersive in the 7-furlong Spinaway in the mud at Saratoga, followed by an equally game effort when she ran third in the Alcibiades over 8.5 furlongs at Keeneland, where she passed the winning post 3 1/4 lengths behind Immersive after being eased slightly close home. Quickkick filled second place, 2 lengths in front of her. A month later, Immersive captures the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies by 4 1/2 lengths, with Quickkick third. You don't get a better form boost than that result and Quietside, who has experience from having been in battles, is a strong contender for the Golden Rod.

ECLATANT, a barnmate to Good Cheer, beat subsequent Pocahontas winner La Cara when winning on over 5.5 furlongs her debut and she followed up with a no-nonsense win in allowance company over 6 furlongs at Keeneland, coming home 1 1/4 lengths ahead of Dancing Magic. Empirical Mischief was a distant third, and that filly was 6 lengths behind La Cara when unplaced in the Pocahontas. Dancing Magic, who was second to Eclatant at Keeneland, failed to frank the form when only fourth in the Myrtlewood Stakes next time out, but Eclatant is a strong, scopey sort with improvement virtually guaranteed. Whether she will appreciate this step up in distance is another matter; she raced prominently throughout and Keeneland and her dam, whose only win came over 5.5 furlongs on turf, is a half-sister to a stakes winning sprinter. >>>

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FLASH WEAR is an interesting longshot who could help boost the Trifecta payoff. 20-1 morning line does not do her justice. Perhaps that would be 10-1 if a filly with her form, trained by one of the top handlers, had been in the mix. Flash Wear improved nicely when stepped up to a mile on her third start, beating next-out winner Carolina Smokeshow comfortably by 4 lengths at Churchill Downs. Her preceding run is also worth taking a look at; she was a clear second to Book'em in a 6-furlong maiden where Keyana took third. Book'em won a Churchill allowance race next time out and Keyana was a 4 1/2-length maiden winner at Keeneland on her subsequent outing. Flash Wear's progressive form should not be overlooked. Note that Book'em runs in R3 here at Churchill today.

CONCLUSION: It looks a two-horse race; Good Cheer against Quietside. Preference is for Good Cheer, though it's easy to make a case for Quietside. The worry about her is that she had some tough races in August and October - while Good Cheer is coming off comfortable wins.

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

JONATHAN'S WAY, failed to fire at the Breeders' Cup and he gets another chance to prove that he one of the best juveniles around here, returning to the venue of his finest hour; a very nice win that qualified him for the championship race at Del Mar, where he finished seventh, 7 lengths behind the controlling gate-to-wire winner Citizen Bull.

Jonathan's way ran much better in a more strongly run race under the Twin Spires back in September. He had overcome a bad start when winning impressively by over four lengths on his debut at Saratoga in August, then took a big step forward following up the one-mile Iroquois Stakes at Churchill Downs a month later. Facing Ellis Park Juvenile Stakes winner Owen Almighty and nine others, Jonathan's Way was sent straight to the lead and he ran hard all the way to win by 2 3/4 lengths. As the betting had suggested, it was Owen Almighty who would be his toughest rival and that colt did stay on gamely for second; though without ever threatening the winner. Jonathan's Way saved ground all the way around, while Owen Almighty did not have such a smooth trip, so it is possible that there's less between these two than what the winning margin suggests. They both ran a race telling us that they are not short on stamina. The winning time, 1.36.08, was 1.74 seconds faster than La Cara's time in the Pocahontas Stakes on the same day. She was all out to win her race and this time difference equals almost nine lengths in a mile race. The clock says that the Iroquois was a good race. Giocosio, 4 1/4 lengths behind Owen Almighty in third place, was coming off a 6 1/4-length maiden win on turf at Ellis Park (on his third start), where he beat Courageous Clay and Minaret Station. The latter won the Bourbon Stakes time next time out (with Giocosio back in sixth place), while Courageous Clay ran second in maiden company at Kentucky Downs on his subsequent start.

After the Bourbon, Giocosio won an allowance race at Churchill Downs, giving the form a further boost - and if Jonathan's Way is back to the form he showed here in September he will win the Kentucky Jockey Club.

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SONIC SKIDADDLE, a May foal by City of Light, was visually impressive when breaking his maiden over 7 furlongs at Churchill Downs in early November, having run seventh at 49-1 on his debut over the same track in September. He was 10-1 when he won and these odds tell us that he has surprised even those closest to him. He was dead last early on in the 7-furlong race, still some 10 lengths off the pace heading for the turn, then picked up like a very smart horse coming down the lane. He finished strongly between horses, passing them one by one to win by 4 3/4 lengths under a hand ride. His runner-up, Reach, was coming off a fifth placed finish on debut at Indiana, while the third placed horse, Cant Stop Munnings (who was 10/11 fav), had run third in a good maiden at Keeneland on his previous start. **RENDER JUDGMENT** ran second in that race and came back to win an 8.5-furlong maiden here at Churchill Downs three weeks later. Like, Sonic Skidaddle, he was also a huge price on his debut but bet down to 8/5 when he won. He is proven over this distance - though it was a moderately run affair, and Sonic Skidaddle make more appeal.

FIRST RESORT reverts to the main track, having run respectably when fourth to New Century in the Summer Stakes on turf at Woodbine in September. New Century went on to finish fourth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, so the form looks solid enough - but First Resort looks exposed and he has been given a somewhat strange campaign.

FILOSO is a more interesting contender, having had a break since finishing third behind East Avenue and Ferocious in the Breeders Futurity at Keeneland in early October. East Avenue lost any chance at the start when favorite for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, where Ferocious also failed to make an impact, but these are still very talented runners, and Filoso is open to improvement. He looked a smart prospect when a step up from 6 furlongs to a mile brought out vast improvement at Saratoga in the summer; he stepped up from a fourth placed effort on debut (when **DAPPER MOON** ran second) to an impressive 3 1/2-length win over Spurgeon, with American Promise beaten 6 1/2 lengths back in third. American Promise was only half a length behind **RENDER JUDGMENT** when second to that colt at Churchill Downs, while Spurgeon was fourth in a Churchill maiden on his next start.

DAPPER MOON also won at Saratoga, outclassing next-out winner Guns Loaded by 5 lengths over 7 furlongs in late August, before running fourth in the Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland (a length behind **FILOSO**) and third, 9 1/4 lengths behind Sovereignty in the Street Sense at Churchill Downs, when Kentucky Downs Juvenile Mile winner **TIZTASTIC** ran second.

CONCLUSION: This is not a strong renewal of the Kentucky Jockey Club. Without strength in depth, trainers with juveniles coming off runs that are below the level normally required to be competitive in a G2 race take a shot; all clearly with 'do not be afraid of one horse' in the back of their minds. That horse is Jonathan's Way, whose form is head and shoulders above the others.

Note these runners and monitor results

Dewolf and Shifty, second and third to **HE'S NOT JOKING** in the Grey Stakes at Woodbine, will both be in action in stakes races with off times prior to this race today; Shifty in the Princess Elizabeth (Woodbine R8) and Dewolf in the Coronation Futurity (Woodbine R10).

Cant Stop Munnings, third when **RENDER JUDGMENT** was second on debut and third when **SONIC SKIDADDLE** won impressively second time out, is set to run in R5 here at Churchill today.

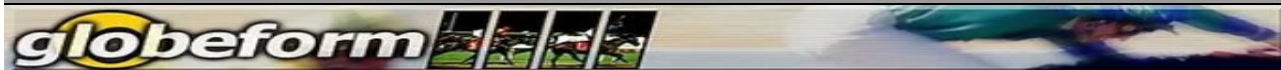

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

CARSON'S RUN is a worthy favorite and it's hard to go against him here. The one thing to be worried about is whether he has kept his form, after having run consistently well in top races for 3yos on the lawns at Saratoga, Kentucky Downs and Aqueduct in the summer months. He was as good as ever when coming from off the pace to win the Jockey Club Derby last time out, beating Deterministicly by three parts of a length. The latter came back to win the Hill Prince Stakes next time out, so the form is solid enough. Carson's Run ran yet another very good race when runner-up to Bellum Justum in the 10.5-furlong Nashville Derby at Kentucky Downs in late August, he is versatile track wise and it will be interesting to see him around Del Mar. A neat, well balanced runner, he will probably find the turning track easier than many other shippers do. He was given far too much to do at Kentucky Downs, where he was flying at the end and only just grabbed second, 2 1/4 lengths behind Bellum Justum, who had run well against much better horses in England and was the heavy favorite. Carson's Run performed to GF 104+ that day, having improved to **Globeform 107p** when coming from off the pace to win the Saratoga Derby three weeks earlier. He won that 9.5-furlong contest in good style, with Legend Of Time three parts of a length behind in second place. Carson's Run had a bit up his sleeve there, he looked strong passing the winning post in the Jockey Club Derby, and he sets the standard in the Hollywood Derby. >>>

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CHATALAS, the only filly in the race, is a fascinating contender. Having performed to **Globeform 103** when she won the Indiana Oaks on dirt back in July, she sits high on the ranking (getting a 3lbs sex weight allowance). Her only turf race was a good effort; she was second in the Blue Norther, spilling Medoro and My Fox Givin, two established turf stakes performers, and who both won next time out. Chatalas, who likes to race prominently, drew well in stall 3, she should get a nice, ground saving trip, she represents the in-form Mark Glatt barn, and there's no way she should be as big as 30-1 in the betting. She meets a bunch on nice colts here but they are not *that* good, and Chatalas does have a chance. She won the Chandelier Stakes last year and her best 3yo form is a notch better.

DONEGAL MOMENTUM has improved markedly since switched to turf two starts back, and his 2-length win in the Gio Ponti over a mile at Aqueduct, where he led all the way and finished the race off strongly, indicated that there will be better still to come from the son of Uncle Mo. He had no problems beating Royal Majesty, who had been fourth, 1 1/2 lengths behind **CARSON'S RUN**, in the Saratoga Derby previously.

KING OF GOSFORD's best form came over 6.5 furlongs, as she checked in third behind solid older sprinters First Peace and Air Force Red in the Eddie D at Santa Anita two starts back. He did not need to produce the same level of form when winning an allowance race over a mile here at Del Mar a month later.

FORMIDABLE MAN, winner of the Del Mar Derby last time out, and **ATITLAN**, a winner of the Twilight Derby after having run third in the Del Mar Derby, are closely matched on form. They both have a chance of hitting the board.

CONCLUSION: The visitors Carson's Run and Donegal Momentum look the strongest and the filly Chatalan has clearly been underrated by the odds maker. This is not a very, very straightforward race but these all make quite a bit of appeal and hopefully the winner comes from our trio.

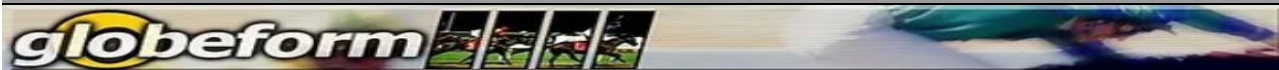

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

The Globeform ratings can - for most races - tell us two things; what horses have the best performances in the book, and what horses simply aren't good enough to win the event. In this race, however, using ratings alone won't help us all that much. All but two of the twelve runners are ranked within 7lbs, which equals 3 1/2 lengths over this distance. With so many in with a chance, racing luck will be a vital factor.

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Let's take two against the field, in what is a wide open affair; Chad Brown's shipper **REDISTRICING**, who was an unlucky loser in the Knickerbocker at Aqueduct in October, and the in-form trainer Mark Glatt's **MI HERMANO RAMON**, who made nice progress from the first to his second start after a long layoff. They are both on **Globeform 106p** and both can be expected to step up again. Redistricting, admittedly not great value at 3-1, was boxed in at Aqueduct; he had to switch around horses inside the final furlong, and when he found daylight it was too late. He dashed home for second, beaten a neck by Andthewinneris, and galloped out past his rivals after passing the winning post. That was Redistricting's first start since last December, when he veered out on the home turn in the Hollywood Derby (having looked a possible winner before the incident). He looks a potential GF 110-112 performer and we know how good Chad is with such horses. Flavien Prat takes the mount, which is another plus.

MI HERMANO RAMON also had a long break, going back to June last year, before making his seasonal debut over this course and distance in August. A nice run for fifth behind Air Force Blue set him up for the Lure Stakes over a mile at Santa Anita in October, when he moved forward to finish second behind SUMTER. The winner had the run of the race that day, slipping away early in the straight, while Mi hermano Ramon was staying on really gamely to lose by just a neck. There will be pace on this time and he should be able to turn the tables on Sumter. Morning line 12-1 looks too big. **SEAL TEAM**, another coming off the bench, rallied from way back to take fifth in the Lure, and he is also one to keep an eye on here - though the short finish may count against him.

CABO SPIRIT put up a game performance when leading every step of the way in the John Henry Turf Cup over 10 furlongs at Santa Anita in late September, returning a career best **Globeform 112**, but he was also handed a soft lead and able to cruise along at a slow pace (25.13 - 50.43 - 1.15.13...). His winning time was more than four seconds outside the track record. That equals about 20 lengths and the clock says it all. Still, his run at the Breeders' Cup wasn't *that* bad, and it will be interesting to see what he can do cutting back in distance. A loose lead is unlikely and the wide post is rather tricky, but Cabo Spirit is coming off two good runs and must be respected.

EASTER is best on ratings and seeing him winning would be no big surprise. He was back to form not that far off his best when fifth behind Johannes in the City of Hope Mile, where **ALMENDARES** - another live contender here - checked in second. Johannes franked the form with a good second behind More Than Looks in the Breeders' Cup Mile.

MASTEROFFOXHOUNDS is a prominent runner with enough class to make his presence felt, but his two most recent runs have been below par, while **FAST BUCK**, highly ranked based on his best form last year, is a sprinter and hard to fancy in this contest.

CONCLUSION: When a race looks 'too difficult', let's try to achieve something that's 'virtually impossible'; hitting the Trifecta with our two A-horses both in the mix with all. There's every chance that we will fail but we can play to small stakes here - knowing that there is also every chance that a big priced horse gets involved, making the board light up.

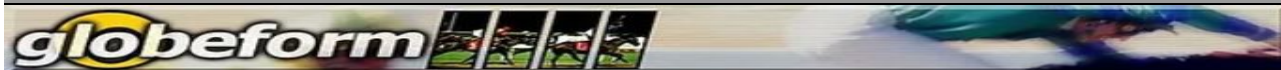

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

TRULY QUALITY, the morning line favorite at 5-2, is hard to get away from in this 12-furlong test. He is coming off four really solid, consistent performances and - if he still holds his form - he should be right up there again in the Hollywood Turf Cup. His most recent success, in the 11-furlong Singspiel Stakes at Woodbine, was gained by coming from way back - but he does not have to be ridden that way. In fact, it was probably not how his jockey Vincent Cheminaud had planned it, when Truly Quality had a bumpy start from the widest gate and ended up some 10 to 12 lengths off the pace. The son of Quality Road was still a long way behind the leaders going into the home turn and, although he had begun his progress, he had six horses in front of him as they entered the final furlong. From there on and in, all eyes were soon glued to one runner; Truly Quality. He stayed on strongly to get up for a game win, beating English Conqueror by 3/4 length. Stone Age was third and Dancin in Da'nile finished fourth. This trio ran 1-2-3 (in reverse order) in a strong allowance heat at Woodbine four weeks later.

Based on ratings, Truly Quality's previous race was even better, as he improved to **Globeform 112** when winning the Colonial Turf Cup by 2 1/2 lengths from the useful yardstick Webslinger, after racing in the first three throughout the 12-furlong trip. He had previously won by 6 lengths at Aqueduct and finished been an unlucky second at Saratoga, where he was beaten a neck by subsequent G3 winner Battle of Normandy. Truly Quality, who is 11-for-12 in the top three, has never raced at Del Mar before but he has performed well over as many as six different tracks in the past, so coming here is probably not going to be an issue. >>>

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BALNIKHOV ran his best race to date when producing **Globeform 112** winning the Dinner Party Stakes on heavy ground at Pimlico in May, when Frankie Dettori produced him with a great run from last to first; he beat Crabs n Beer (who relished the conditions) and the future stakes winner Running Bee by 1 1/2 lengths and 3 lengths. That was over 9 furlongs but conditions were so bad (nowhere near the official 'soft') and stamina did come into play. Third placed effort is in the 9-furlong Eddie Read and paceless 11-furlong Del Mar Handicap were also gained by coming from off the pace, and Balnikhov is a horse who may love stretching out to 12 furlongs. He was close behind **Dicey Mo Chara** in both of those events. His most recent start, when second last behind **Cabo Spirit** in the John Henry Turf Cup, is best forgotten; the winner got away with silly fractions on the lead that day and Balnikhov was badly compromised by the lack of pace. Well bred, he comes from the same family as Midships, who won the 12-furlong San Luis Rey Stakes and the 10-furlong Charlie Whittingham Memorial and the as a four-year-old.

CABO SPIRIT put up a game performance when leading every step of the way in the John Henry Turf Cup over 10 furlongs at Santa Anita in late September, returning a career best **Globeform 112**, but he was also handed a soft lead and able to cruise along at a slow pace (25.13 - 50.43 - 1.15.13...). His winning time was more than four seconds outside the track record. That equals about 20 lengths and the clock says it all. Still, he did beat four of today's rivals readily; Dicey Mo Chara (4th), Divin Propos (6th), Rockemperor (9th) and Balnikhov (10th), and his run at the Breeders' Cup wasn't *that* bad, so perhaps 12-1 morning line is a bit too high. One would have to respect him a lot more if this contest was half a mile shorter though. He is unlikely to get loose on the lead again this time, and others make more appeal.

ROCKEMPEROR is too big at **10-1** on the morning line. Yes, he had **Dicey Mo Chara** and **Balnikhov** in front of him when fourth in the Del Mar Handicap and he was only ninth in the John Henry, but both of those races were run at a really slow pace, something that does not suit this horse at all. Take a look back on his run in the San Juan Capistrano at Santa Anita back in June (before he was given a break); a reproduction of that form gives him a winning chance in the Hollywood Turf Cup. Just off the pace and racing with great zest all the way in the 14-furlong event, he led a furlong out and kept on fighting to be second, a neck behind the late charging Planetario, who won the race for a second time and also set a new track record. Planetario was coming off a good third in the Charlie Whittingham, beaten just a head by Gold Phoenix. Rockemperor ran to **Globeform 110** in the San Luis Rey, proving that he has retained his ability at age eight. Give him a decent pace and he could become dangerous. Not only does he stay this trip, he gets further, and a jockey switch to J J Hernandez is also a plus.

DICEY MO CHARA, who is 6-for-9 in the top three at Del Mar, lost by 2 lengths when fourth to Cabo Spirit in the John Henry. He is now 2lbs better off at the weights, the longer distance should suit him better than Cabo Spirit, and he must have a shot at turning the tables here. A game and consistent performer, Dicey Mo Chara has run to GF 107 - 109 - 108 in his three most recent races, and he must be considered. His prominent stalking running style gives him options, and he gets an upgrade in the saddle as Flavien Prat will be his partner in the Hollywood Turf Cup. Prat, who is in excellent form, is likely to give Dicey Mo Chara a nice, ground saving trip just off the pace from post three, and he is another with a decent chance.

DIVIN PROPOS, was also compromised by the lack of pace in the John Henry, and he did well to finish sixth, passing the winning post 3 1/2 lengths behind Cabo Spirit. A French import, he was favorite for all of his three previous races in California, and won two of them; a 10-furlong allowance heat at Santa Anita in June and an 11-furlong allowance heat at Del Mar in August, when he came from just off the pace to lead heading into the short stretch and win readily by a length from Offlee Naughty. Offlee Naughty has not been as good this year as he was in '23 (when he won G2 and G3 events at Santa Anita) but Divin Propos put up a good performance to beat him, earning **Globeform 109** in the process, a figure that puts him in with a chance here. This four-year-old gelding by George Vancouver was purchased for €150,000 (\$158,000) at last year's Arqana Arc Sales. He won twice and ran third to subsequent G1 performer Zarakem in a Listed race over 10 furlongs in France. His dam, Psyche, was no start but she won 8 times from 55 runs, producing her best form between 8 and 10 furlongs. She has also produced a filly who won twice over 10 furlongs in France, so everything points to Divin Propos being capable of running handling 12 furlongs at Del Mar. >>>

Globeform's Thanksgiving Week Special

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GOLDENEYE is an interesting longshot coming off a couple of taking allowance wins over 12 furlongs at Kentucky Downs and Keeneland, where he enjoyed the run of the race - and a great Flavien Prat ride - to beat Six Minus by half a length in October. While Peter Eurton, who ought to know what Californian turf form is worth, takes Goldeneye to this G2 at Del Mar, Prat has deserted him in favor of Dicey Mo Chara. It's hard to place him in this context, he does take a step up in class but Goldeneye is one of the four runners in this race who has won over the distance. It might be wise to find a way to include him Trifecta plans.

CONCLUSION: Truly Quality, who is flexible when it comes to tactics, is the most likely winner but - tough as he is - it's worth bearing in mind that it is difficult for a horse to keep on running up to his best through five consecutive races (even if they are spaced out like in this case). If his form takes a dip, well then this race becomes wide open, with half the field in with a chance.

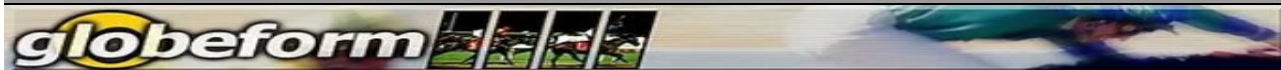

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

RATTLE N ROLL was beaten by Hit Show and Cooke Creek in the Lukas Classic a month ago but that was his first start since running fourth in the 2023 edition of that event, and he was not given a hard time by his rider. Not only was he coming off a 12-month break, he was also racing over a sloppy track, something that does not seem to suit him. The run will have brought him on, he is clearly the best horse in this field, the 9-furlong trip is just perfect and he has a solid record here at Churchill Downs. **So why is he as big as 5-1 on the morning line?** Hard to understand; let's just hope it proves to be right. Rattle N Roll ran to **Globeform 117** at his best in 2023, when he went from a nice win in the Blame Stakes to a game runner-up effort in the Stephen Foster, beaten half a length by West Will Power. He does not need to run up to that mark to win the Clark, where we have four potential speed horses in the mix; meaning that the pace scenario is likely to suit Rattle N Roll. He is the obvious selection. >>>

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CRUPI is coming back after a layoff since running well below his best in the four-runner Woodward Stakes at Aqueduct in late September; he was third, 14 lengths behind Tapit Trice. His performances in the Pegasus World Cup (a staying-on third to National Treasure), Suburban (off-the-pace win over Bendoog) and the Whitney, where he improved to **Globeform 113** as he finished well from off the pace to take second, 2 1/4 lengths behind Arthur's Ride (who he was spotting 4lbs), were all much better efforts. A strong pace would bring Crupi right into the top picture here. He has won twice off the bench and he must be considered.

RED ROUTE ONE has had a break since early July, when he came from well back to win the Cornhusker at Prairie Meadows. Coming with his customary late charge, he got up to beat next-out winner Unload by half a length while conceding 6lbs. It was a game win but Red Route One did not need to be at his absolute best that day. His best performance to date, worth **Globeform 112**, came when he beat Touchuponstar by 2 lengths to capture the 9-furlong New Orleans Stakes at the Fair Grounds back in March. Like Crupi, he is a runner who needs a strong pace to close into, and he is running over what seems to be his ideal distance.

HIT SHOW's consistency and winning attitude count for a lot; he has won his last three races, all by under a length, and he thus takes good recent form to the table. Having beaten **COOKE CREEK** by a neck in the Lukas Classic over 9 furlongs in the slop at Churchill Downs, he followed up in the Fayette at Keeneland, run over the same distance but on a fast track; grinding out a 3/4-length verdict over a stubborn **BOLZY**, with **UNO MAS BOURBON** 4 lengths further adrift in third place. With 7 wins and a second from 14 starts, and a 2-for-4 record over this track, Hit Show will get plenty of attention but he is coming off a couple of hard races, and - like most of these - he is not likely to improve.

CROOKE CREEK, so game in defeat in the Lukas Classic, falls into the same bracket. A shrewd claim by Mike Maker, he won three race on the trot (beating a couple of useful next out winners) before stepping up in class and it's not impossible that he can hit the board even in this contest.

MOST WANTED, the best of the two 3yo's in the field, is a front-runner coming off a win in the Oklahoma Derby over 9 furlongs at Remington Park. He beat E J Won the Cup by a length, and that colt had previously landed the Turf Paradise Derby, but these were not strong stakes events. Most Wanted needs to improve markedly to have a chance here. It's interesting that Florent Geroux rides him, rather than the more accomplished barnmate Hit Show, but riding arrangements often have more to do with ownerships and previous agreements than just form.

CONCLUSION: Rattle N Roll is a must bet at 5-1, even at around 7-2 he would be value. Sure, he needs to move forward after his comeback but that was just a prep for this race and it is very likely that he will be close to his best here. If so, they won't beat him. In act, he can win without running up to his Foster or Pimlico Special form of last year.

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GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

Trainer Brad Cox has said that he prefers to run Giant Mischief in the Fall Highweight at Aqueduct, where the colt has an outside post, rather than in this race, where he drew the rail. Assuming that Giant Mischief is heading in that direction, deciding on the Thanksgiving Classic pick is easy; it has to be Montalcino.

MONTALCINO is the most exciting young sprinter around and, all being well, this Cherie DeVaux trainee will be pointed to the prestigious Malibu Stakes at Santa Anita on December 26 after this race. Having performed to **Globeform 116p** already on his second start, and getting in with a favorable weight, he will be hard to beat. This twice raced 3yo won well on his debut at Saratoga, beating Masmak, who came back to win on his two subsequent outings (the third placed horse also won next time. Montalcino stepped up to allowance company at Keeneland, where he was even more impressive winning by 6 lengths over 7 furlongs. He set fractions similar to Federal Judge's in the 6-furlong Phoenix later on the card and outclassed his rivals to win by 6 lengths plus. His runner-up, Banned for Life won an allowance race at Churchill Downs on Sunday, advertising Montalcino's form even further. He looks a typical sprinter but he a son of Take Charge Indy and his unraced dam is a daughter of Stage Luck (a Listed winner over 8.5 furlongs who was third in the Ruffian), so there is a chance that he will stay a mile in due course.

BO CRUZ is coming off a long break, not having raced since winning the Commonwealth over 7 furlongs at Keeneland almost eight months ago. That win was clearly his career best. He raced up with the pace all the way and drew off for a solid 2 1/2-length win over **MINNESOTA READY**, who he is set to meet again here. Minnesota Ready has had five outings since and he showed similar form when winning a stakes at Lone Star Park in May. He has to shoulder 124lbs here, however, and he probably gets the rail post, so he is hard to fancy. Bo Cruz can make his presence felt though. He won like a progressive sprinter at Keeneland - then became sidelined. Well drawn in 10, and with speed plus a bit of stamina, he should not be dismissed. Note that he won by 3 lengths after a break at Churchill Downs last year. What's not so good is trainer Albert Stall Jr's 8% rate in stakes events.

CHAMPLIN has been in good form of late and this lightly raced 4yo is definitely one to use in the Trifecta plans. A winner of 4 of his 7 races, unbeaten in two starts here at the Fair Grounds, he ran a fine race to beat Gulfport over a sloppy track at Churchill Downs in late September, and was a game second to that same rival in the 6-furlong Bet on Sunshine at the same venue four weeks ago. Gulfport got the better of him by a neck that day, with the same margin back to Angkor, who has also done well in races at that level this year. Champlin gets the widest post this time, he is quick early and he loves this distance.

RED FLAG won a stakes calibre allowance race over 6.5 furlongs on the Breeders' Cup Friday card at Del Mar, improving to **Globeform 113** as he swept past his foes to win the race with authority, beating Skinner by 2 1/2 lengths over the 6.5-furlong trip. Sprinting is not Skinner's game but he went straight from that effort to capture the Native Diver Stakes (a nice 7-2 winner for us) and Zeus' War, who was third, 4 lengths behind Red Flag, also ran well on his next start, taking second in the Oakland Stakes at Pleasanton. Red Flag, who was claimed for \$40,000 at Del Mar, has won his last three races and he might still be on an upward curve. There's enough speed in the mix to set the race up as he likes it. >>>

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MILES AHEAD won this race in 2023, beating next out winner Super Ocho very easily by 4 1/2 lengths and performing to **Globeform 116**. He was favorite and the form was no fluke. This veteran sprinter has run to that sort of level on a few occasions in the past - but the worry this time is his current form. His two runs after the win were both way below his best and he has not raced since early April.

CONCLUSION: Getting 4-1 about Montalcino would be like an early Christmas Present but, especially with Giant Mischief out, it is not going to happen. Still, 2-1 wouldn't be bad either, for a horse whose talent says he ought to be even money. Picking a clear second is not easy; Red Flag (possible improver), Champlin (course specialist in good form) and Bo Cruz (looked a bit classy in the spring) all have an equal chance. Miles Ahead is impossible to toss.

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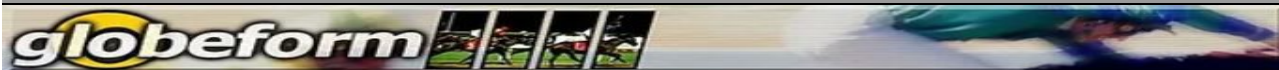

GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS

POUNCE is coming off two unplaced efforts, but looking three starts back, to her win in the Lake George Stakes at Saratoga in July, we find a performance that makes her good enough to win the Mrs. Revere. That's if she can get back to that level, **Globeform 106**, we saw her operating at when she came from off the pace to beat Oversubscribed by 3/4 length while spotting her runner-up 2lbs. That was a strong run and it confirmed the promise Pounce had showed when coming from even further back to win the Herecomesthebride at Gulfstream Park back in March (beating Mox Fox Giving and **Dancing N Dixie**). Pounce has never raced on turf at Churchill Downs before but she has been around a bit, competing at six >

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>>> different courses in her nine races, and coming here is unlikely to be a problem. Current form might be though; she packed it in very easily when ninth to She Feels Pretty in the Queen Elizabeth II at Keeneland last time out (when going off at 36-1) and she filled the same place behind **Simply in Front** in the Music City at Kentucky Downs. That course does not suit every horse and the 6.5-furlong trip was clearly too short for Pounce. She is talented but she is also inconsistent, so there's no way we can make her the selection, despite her high rating, but it's unwise to write her off. Morning line 20-1 is way too big for this contender.

PIN UP BETTY was another who could not show her true colors at Kentucky Downs, finishing sixth there two starts back - but she is quite the opposite to Pounce; this Mike Maker trainee is very game and consistent. She ran to Globeform 105 both when fourth to Cinderella's Dream in the 9.5-furlong Belmont Oaks at Aqueduct and when narrowly beaten by Waves of Mischief in the Pucker Up over 9 furlongs at Colonial Downs, and she returned GF 104 on her most recent outing, finishing fourth in the Queen Elizabeth II over 9 furlongs at Keeneland, 6 3/4 lengths behind the high class She Feels Pretty. A flexible type who can race up with the pace or sit just off of it, Pin Up Betty drops back into her right class here, and she is a live contender. One negative is the cut back in distance, as her best form has come over further than the Mrs. Revere trip.

KEHOE BEACH will be making her stakes debut and this filly is very interesting. Trained by Wesley Ward and ridden by Frankie Dettori, she is coming off an impressive front running win over a mile at Keeneland in October, where she set good fractions and outclassed her 11 rivals, looking like a stakes winner in the making. She won comfortably by 5 1/2 lengths from Belle of Rights, with Work of Fiction third. Those two are not up to graded stakes standard but Kehoe Beach was so much the best, improving to Globeform 104p. Her 8 1/2-length win at Kentucky Downs in September was also impressive, and Kehoe Beach could prove hard to beat in the Mrs. Revere. She was absolutely hammered in the betting at Keeneland, where her price dropped from 7/5 during the post parade five minutes out, to evens while loading and right down to 1/2 by the time the gates opened. >>>

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MINOUSHKA made an excellent start to her US career when winning an 8.5-furlong allowance race at Keeneland in October. Her comfortable three-length win was gained over fellow three-year-old Smooth Waves, who was unplaced on her subsequent outing. Minoushka went off favourite under jockey Tyler Gaffalione, who produced the filly with a strong run from well off the pace, finding gaps between horses at the finish and winning the race with more in hand. Minoushka, who galloped out well after passing the winning post, had better form in France and ML 9-2 makes her a tempting bet here. She was a bit headstrong early in the season, when racing just off the pace (fitted with a hood in two of her races). The daughter of Starspangledbanner ran to **Globeform 103** when second to Candala (G1 placed since) in the Prix de la Grotte back in April, was then unplaced in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1,000 Guineas) and third to Les Reys in a good edition of the Prix Volterra before being exported across the pond. Les Reys, now with Christophe Clement, won the Winter Memories Stakes at Aqueduct in September but was beaten by **Poolside With Slim**, **Pharoah's Wine**, Buttercream Babe and **Simply if Front** when fifth in the Valley View a month ago.

CONCLUSION: Kehoe Beach had no difficulties getting to the lead from stall 10 at Keeneland and she is drawn in stall 3 here, so expect to see Dettori sending her once more. She can get a ground saving trip in front. Dettori is a master when it comes to runners like this; he always manages to get his mount into its comfort zone while dictating, and he could well pull this off. Minoushka is the opposite; she might be held up for a late run again, in which case her connections will be hoping for solid early fractions. As Pin Up Betty is best over further, she is another who will benefit from early pace, as is Pounce. Who might put pressure on the leader? Pharoah's Wine (4) and Simply in Front (10) maybe, but they do not have the same cruising speed as her.
